April, Gwendolyn Marie (Johnson) Trapp Mays 22 Dec 1948-15 Apr 1991 Born to Willie J. & Emma Pearl (Byas) Weathersby. Married to John April. Died in Dallas.

Arceneaux, Julie Mae (Tolliver) Edmerson

11 Apr 1918-11 Apr 2018

Born to Johnny Manney & Allie Mae (Brown) Tolliver. Married 1)1945 Dan Edmerson 2)1954 Lionel Arceneaux. Earned Bachelors degree in 1940 from Prairie View A&M College, Waller County, Texas, and Masters in 1954. Taught chemistry, Spanish and French and elementary classes for 38 years in Port Arthur school district and adult night school for 10 years. Very active in community, Eastern Star, bridge clubs, and club to support new mothers. Founder of local credit union and served as elections judge in her precinct.

Armstead, Albert Louis

15 May 1930-2 Dec 2018.

Born to Alonzo & Arthur Claudis (Dennis) Armstead. He was Ollie Giles' second cousin. Married Johnnie Marie Odoms. In 1950, he was employed washing cars at a garage. In 2008, recognized for his exceptional leadership and devotion to Operation Kid Care and his years of service to Crime Stoppers of Hays County.

Armstead, Alonzo

6 Sep 1908-19 Feb 1960

Born to Ernest & Agnes (Fuller) Armstead. Married to Arthur Claudis Dennis. Alonzo was a janitor at South West Texas University when he died of a broken neck after losing control of his car on a side road off the Seguin Highway.

Armstead, Johnnie Marie (Odams)

19 Oct 1933-28 Feb 2008

Born to Johnny & Ruby (Odoms) Armstead at Prairie Lea, Caldwell County, moving to San Marcos at the age of five. Married Albert Armstead in 1949 while still at high school. Began fulltime college education at South West Texas (now Texas State University) but this was put on hold so she could babysit while her daughter went to graduate school. Worked eight years as a teacher's aide and taught English as a second language. Also worked at the Democratic Party headquarters in San Marcos. Very active in Greater Bethel Baptist Church in San Marcos as well as the Calaboose Museum which she founded in 1997. Other activities include Hays County Historical Commission for 12 years; secretary for Preservation Associates and Heritage Association; member of Blue Ribbon Committee on Tourism; president of Church Women United, Chair of Fine Arts Committee; Chair of Committee for Renaming Comal Street as Martin Luther King Jr Drive,; and involved with Girl Scouts for 20 years. She wrote a chapter on Black women in Texas history for Dr. David Williams' *Bricks Without Straw,* a comprehensive study of African Americans in Texas.

Barnes, John Henry Circa 1830 - 5 Sep 1894 Born a slave in Alabama. Married Sophia Lynch. Farmer.

Barnett, Baby 7 Dec 1915-14 Dec 1915 Born to Reuben & Hattie (Calvin) Barnett. Died of malnutrition at one week old.

Barnett, Ellen (Howard) 4 Apr 1853-19 Aug 1893 Born a slave. Married 1882 to Andy Barnett who owned a farm near Kyle. Ellen already had a son, Charles Howard, aged 7 in 1880.

Barnett, Hattie (Calvin) 17 May 1885-29 Jul 1964 Born to Henry & Sarah (Calvin) Barnett. Married to Reuben Barnett in 1909. In 1930 was a cook for a boarding house. Died of carcinoma of the stomach.

Barnett, Jane 25 Dec /1844 -16 Jul 1909 Born a slave in Mississippi. Married to Richmond Barnett, also born a slave in Mississippi, a farmer owning 25 acres in Elijah Clark league, northwest of San Marcos, by1900.

Barnett, Janey L. Born and died 1915

Barnett, Reuben 25 Dec 1887-30 Jan 1951 Born to Richmond & Janie Barnett. Married to Hattie Calvin. Owned a 35-acre farm in the Thomas J. Chambers league and was also a cook. In 1945, Reuben (referred to as the colored cook) was included in the three carloads of hunters who headed to the annual South Texas Wolf Hunt on the Amberson Ranch near Cotulla. Died of carcinoma of the prostate.

Bates, Blanche (Massie) 12 May 1884-11 Jul 1943 Born to Charlie & Annie (Bunton) Massie. In 1940, she is listed as a cook, widowed, residing on Purgatory Street, San Marcos, with her bachelor son, Charles E. Carr. Employed as a maid. Died of chronic nephritis.

Bates Sarah Circa 1844 - Nov 17 1897 Born a slave in Tennessee. Married to Perry Bates, also born a slave in Tennessee. Sarah had a child, Iris, born circa 1860 before her marriage to Perry. Perry's second wife (1900) was Fannie Armstead.

Beard, Payton E. 22 Oct 1910-28 May 1954.

Born to Rufus & Hattie (Griffin) Beard. A trucker for a wholesale grocery. Died of glomerula nephritis and cirrhosis of the liver.

Beard, Rufus Sr. 1875-3 Nov 1922 Born Caldwell County. Mother's name was Mandy. Married to Hattie Griffin. Laborer at lumberyard. Died of pulmonary tuberculosis.

Beard, Willie Mae (Kennan) 1909-1 Mar 1989 Married Payton Beard in 1928. She was a cook. Member of the Eastern Star.

Berry, Ruby Annabelle (Garrett) Powell 24 Dec 1967-7 May 1967 Born to Willie & Carolina (Bullock) Garrett. Married 1. Oscar Powell c. 1901 2. Isaiah Charles "I C" Berry, a carpenter, c. 1910.

Black, Martha Louise (Burleson) 16 Sep 1918-1985 Born to Robert Cartwright & Mary Louise (Bradley) Burleson.

Booker, Anna 5 May1876-28 Nov 1902 Married 1899 to Robert Booker, a hotel waiter in 1900. Anna was a cook.

Bolden, Roland S. Jr. 8 Feb 1916-8 Mar 1961 Born in Virginia. Porter in men's clothing store in 1950

Bowens, Harry 18 Oct 1916-11 Mar 1984 His obituary states he was survived by uncles, Walter Dallas Durham and James Clark, aunts Sarah Brady & Peggy Jean Davis

Bowens, Charles M. 11 Sep 1882-22 Apr 1969 Born in Oklahoma to John Miles & Emma Bowens. Married Julia Jackson (later Applewhite) in 1908. In 1910 he was a furniture varnisher and she a midwife. Died of chromic pyelonephritis.

Boyd, Ora Vernice (Byas) 14 Aug 1937-5 Aug 2017 Born to George & Gertrude (Byas) Boyd. Attended South West Texas State University and Trinity Univertsity. Employed at Gary Job Corps for 20 years as Residential Advisor. Very active in Wesley Chapel AME Church in San Marcos, president of the Missionary Society, member of Steward Board and chaired many committees.

Bradie, James Hardy 11 May 1890-8 May 1953 Born to John & Menervy (Brown) Bradie. Private in Co D 24th Regiment of Infantry, US Army in WWI. In action June 18-19, 1919, in the Battle of Juarez when Pancho Villa's Villista forces were defeated at Ciudad Juarez, Mexico. Died of bronchopneumonia and cerebral hemorrhage.

Bradley, Isaiah Sr.

15 Apr 1845-31 Dec 1908

Born a slave in Louisiana. Married to Lucretia Pierce, a slave born in Alabama. Farmer owning three acres in the Thomas J Chambers league by 1897.

Bradley, John Bland 20 Nov 1872-6 Sep 1927 Born to Isiah Bradley. Married to Sarah.

Bradley, Mary Elizabeth (Smith) 14 Jun 1877-9 Apr 1948 Born to Charles & Mary Ann Smith. Married 1894 to William Bradley. Died in a diabetic coma.

Bradley, Sarah 15 Apr 1846 - 31 Dec 1908 Born a slave. Married to Isaiah Bradley Sr.

Bradley, William 14 Aug 1884-15 Nov 1935 Born to Isaiah & Creasie (Horn) Bradley. Married to Mary Elizabeth Smith. Laborer. Died of influenza.

Bradley, William 16 Oct 1898-13 Jan 1931 Born to William & Mary Elizabeth (Smith) Bradley. Died in Dallas.

Brady, Carrie (Armstead) 7 Apr 1893-23 Jan 1960 Born to Sandy & Louise E. (Franklin) Armstead. Married. Died of cerebral hemorrhage

Brady, Dora Lee

28 Oct 1891-8 Mar 1991

Born to Webb & Alice (Lawshe) Brady. She was a twin with Dora Alice who died from burns at age six. Dora Lee grew up on a ranch and also picked cotton. She became housekeeper for Miss Annie Whisenant on her Hilliard/Mitchell Ranch off Lime Kiln Road. When Annie moved to Canyon Drive in San Marcos, she brought Dora with her. Dora later was cook/housekeeper for Mrs. Henry Kyle who painted a scene inside the First Baptist Church of the Jordan River in the 1950s when the church was renovated. Dora commissioned the painting and formed a committee of church women who raised the funds by taking in washing and ironing. The First Baptist Church NBC Dora Brady Community Center was named in her honor in San Marcos. Once retired and in her late 80s, Dora Lee channeled her energy into keeping the curb lines tidy for several blocks from her home at the corner of Nance and Comal streets.

Brady, Elie 2 Dec 1876-Oct 5 1958 Born to Tom & Martha (Woods) Brady. Servant to Sam & Nollie Kone on Belvin Street, San Marcos, living in along with nine-months-old son, Chester Brady, in 1900 but Chester is not with her in 1910. Had two children by the name of Brown (Chester & Ed). Died of malnutrition.

Brady, Walter 10 May 1912-20 May 2005 Born in Kyle to B. & Lou (Franklin) Brady. Served in US Army in WWII.

Bratton, Armentha Clennette (Burleson) 4 Aug 1930-13 Sep 1979

Born to Clennon B. & Ida Beatrice (Johns) Burleson. Married to Johnnie Bratton Sr.

Bratton, Johnnie Sr. 20 Jun 1920-27 Sep 1986 Married to Armentha Burleson. Master Sergeant US Air Force.

Bright, Addie (Cheatham) 2 Dec 1882-28 May 1969 Born to Richard & Mishion/Mission (Taylor) Cheatham. Married John Bright, a farmer. In 1920, they and their children were in Caldwell County. In 1940, a lunch room dishwasher, Addie lodged in San Marcos with Kenneth & Marilou Ryan, but had moved in with her sister, Lettie Crayton, and her husband, Jim Crayton, by 1950 when she was a cook. On stone with Lettie (Cheatham) Crayton who was her sister. Addie was living with Lettie and her husband, Jim, in 1950.

Broadnax, John 14 Nov 1874-15 Sep 1954 Born in Guadalupe County to John & Texana (Merryweather) Broadnax. Married Rachel Toliver. Oil mill worker. Died of chronic endocarditis.

Broadnax, Rachel (Toliver) 16 Jul 1894-12 Jun 1964 Born to Richard & Fannie (Clark) Toliver. Married to John Broadnax. Died of cerebral thrombosis.

Brown, Beulah Pearl (Cheatham) 18 May 1898-24 Jan 1950 Born to Mose & Mahalay (Lawshe) Cheatham. Married to Walter Thomas Brown. Died of congestive heart failure.

Brown, Chester 21 Aug 1899-23 Aug 1982 Son of Elie Brady. Listed as Chester Brady when a baby in 1900. Married to Mary L. In 1850, janitor at a St. Marcos high school. Obituary states survivors were nieces Peggy, and Tony Byas.

Brown, Clara (Nance) Dec 1851-25 Jun 1931 Born a slave. Married to Joseph Brown in 1875. Died of heart disease.

Brown, Emma (Ford) Giles Aug 1872-8 Feb 1941 Born to George & Eliza (Ratcliff) Ford. Married to James Harrison "Pat" Brown who played the bass drum for the San Marcos Negro Band. San Marcos Record (02/14/1941) states that she was a natural leader, *"a credit and help to her race here in San Marcos."* Emma was prominent in the affairs of the Wesley Chapel AME Church, acting as the secretary. She invested in property and owned a number of rental properties. She was the mother of Ghost Brown, "San *Marcos' contribution to professional baseball ranks among the negroes."* He was catcher for Coles Chicago Giants. Died of coronary occlusion.

Brown, Fannie 9 Oct 1885-17 Aug 1911 Married to James M. Brown who was a school teacher in 1910.

Brown, Herman 9 Oct 1900-23 Jan 1948 Born to Walter & Madie (Fields) Brown. Laborer. Served in WWII, Tex TEC 5 572 Port Co TC. Died in a fire at his home.

Brown, James R. "Ghost" 16 May 1895 -21 Jan 1943 Born to John Harrison & Emma (Giles) Brown. Divorced. Porter and waiter. Professional baseball player for Coles Chicago Giants. Died of cardiac failure.

Brown, Jo Ann 18 Sep 1948-11 Oct 1988 Born to Joseph Lewis & Marie Josephine (McHenry) Brown.

Brown, John Harrison "Pat"

6 Nov1867- 7 April 1935

Born to Jesse & Mary (Dixon) Brown. Married to Emma Ford. Employed by O.C. Smith Gin Company. He was one of the largest property owners in San Marcos' African American community. His funeral was one of the largest African American ones held in San Marcos. In the procession was the San Marcos Negro band in which he had played the bass drum and the Coles Chicago Giants baseball team, in Austin during a tour of Texas. His son, James "Ghost" Brown was their catcher. Died of myocardial degeneration

Brown, Joseph Lewis

31 Jan 1912-31 Dec 1959

Born to Walter Thomas & Beulah Pearl Cheatham. Married to Marie Josephine McHenry. Graduate of Prairie View A & M. Was a postal clerk. Served in US Army in WWII. Member of American Woodsmen Lodge and PTS, a postal employee organization. Lived 13 years in Houston where he died of respiratory insufficiency due to bronchogenic carcinoma.

Brown, Marie Josephine (McHenry) 26 Dec 1919 - 1957 Born to Joe & Addie Mae (Taylor) McHenry. Married to Joseph Lewis Brown.

Brown, Martha "Mattie" (Kyle) 27 Aug 1889-1 Jul 1957 Born to Robert & Phillis (Hartfield) Kyle. Married to Sam Brown. Proprietor of a soft-drink stand in 1950. Died of chronic myocarditis.

Brown, Mattie E. (Lawshe) 4 Apr 1873-24 May 1963 Born to Ed & Martha (Woods) Lawshe. Married. Lived in Waco for 71 years where she was a member of Pilgrim Lodge, returning to San Marcos to be with her relatives.

Brown, Pearl (Miller) 3 Mar 1894- 3 Dec 1986 Daughter of Isaac & Ellen (Roberts) Miller.

Brown, Sam 28 Jan 1886-3 May 1950 Born to Joe and Clara (Nance) Brown. Married to Martha "Mattie" Kyle. Farmer and worked in hardware store. Died of chronic myocarditis.

Brown, Terrance 23 Jan 1974-30 Mar 1975 Born to Earma (Harris) Brown. Died of asphyxiation from aspiration of gastric contents caused by gastroenteritis.

Brown, Walter Thomas 25 Jul 1880-23 Mar 1948 Born to Joe & Clare (Nance) Brown. Married Beulah Pearl Cheatham. Janitor at First National Bank in San Marcos for 35 years. Deacon of First Baptist Church and member of K of P Lodge and American Woodsmen. Died of coronary thrombosis.

Burleson, Annie 1892-24 Oct 1918 Born to Jim & Bell (Driscoll) Brown. Married to Lemon Burleson in 1910. Living near Martindale in Caldwell county when she died of pneumonia resulting from influenza.

Burleson, Ben Buren 18 Jan 1900-28 Feb 1921 Born to George & Eliza (Patrick) Burleson. Never married. Laborer. Died of heart trouble.

Burleson, Clennon B. 9 Jan 1904-5 Nov 1962 Born in Caldwell County to Jerry & Julia (Cox) Burleson. Married to Ida Beatrice Johns. Worked as a dry cleaner in a laundry. Died of coronary occlusion.

Burleson, Frederick Christopher 19 Sep 1960-13 Dec 2002 Born to Harold Eugene & Frances Neil (Jackson) Burleson. Stepfather was Morris Williams. His wife, Alice, was living in San Antonio at the time of his death.

Burleson, Ida Beatrice (Johns) 16 Oct 1911-11 Jul 1964 Born to Robert & Anna (Miller) Johns. Married to Clennon B. Burleson. Died of hypertensive encephalopathy.

Burleson, Lula 1870-18 Aug 1952 Married to Charles Burleson.

Burleson, Mary Louise 16 Sep 1918-1921 Born to Robert Cartwright & Mary Louise (Bradley) Burleson

Burleson, Mary Louise (Bradley) 25 Jul 1880-4 Jul 1954 Born to Isaiah & Lucretia (Pierce) Bradley. Married to Robert Cartwright Burleson. Died of carcinoma of intestine and hemiplegia.

Burleson, Robert Cartwright 12 May 1870-9 Jan 1966 Born to Robert Edward & Belle Burleson. Married to Mary Louise Bradley. Rancher. Died of coronary occlusion.

Burleson, Willie Gaston

30 Sep 1903- 22 Oct 1985

Born to Robert C. Burleson. Married 1925 Willie Mae Hardeman. Diligent worker for San Marcos' First Baptist Church, serving as church treasurer, Sunday school superintendent and president of the deacon board.

Burleson, Willie Mae (Hardeman) 28 Mar 1906-6 May 1999 Born to Emmanuel Jeremiah & Johanna (Steward) Hardeman on a farm near Joilet, Caldwell County. Married 1925 Willie Gaston Burleson. After coming to San Marcos in 1923, faithful member of First Baptist Church, serving as Sunday school teacher, president of the missionary board, deaconess and chairwoman of many committees. Member of No. 510 of Heroines of Jericho and Carver Court No. 13 of the Court of Calanthe.

Byas, George William 2 Nov 1892-24 Jun 1958 Born to James & Nicie (Brown) Byas. Married Gertrude Jackson. Served as a private in Company B 349 MG Battalion in US Army in WWI. Died of acute pyelonephritis and adenocarcinoma of prostate.

Byas, Gertrude (Jackson) 9 Apr 1903-29 Oct 1986 Born to Ed & Pearl Jackson. Married 1925 George Byas Sr. Children born in San Marcos, Killeen, Austin and Los Angeles.

Byas, Jessie 1890-1921 Born to George William & Nicie (Brown) Byas. Cook.

Calvin, John 16 Apr 1888 - 22 Jan 1946 Born to Henry & Sarah (Dixon) Calvin. Married to Pearl Deloney in 1914.

Calvin, Mattie (Miller) 20 Dec 1892-28 Oct 1969 Born to Isihac & Ellen (Roberts) Miller. Married 1917 to Lonnie Calvin who is buried in Skyview Cemetery.

Carr, Andrew 3 Nov 1909-5 Nov 1971 Born to Prince & Blanche (Massey) Carr. Married to Lottie Sanders. Cook. Private in 4054 Service Company in World War II. Died of pulmonary embolization.

Carr, Lottie (Sanders) 26 June 1892-13 May 1968 Born to George and Lydia (Gray) Sanders. Married Andrew Carr. Cerebral vascular accident, Diabetes mellitus.

Carver, Earley 22 Nov 1897 -2 Sep 1947 Born to Zack & Sally (Cosey) Rucker, according to death certificate. 1900 census shows him and his parents with his grandmother, Fannie Adam, but in 1920 census , he is with Jess & Mary Carver. At time of death he was married. Served in Company A 27 OM Service Battalion, US Army, during WWII. His occupation was butcher. Died of hypertensive cardiovascular disease. American Legion (African American) post names after him in 1947. Carver, Lovie Mae (Farmer) Martin May 1896 -18 May 1970 Born at Kyle to John & Mary (Porter) Farmer. Married 1914 Thomas Martin. She was a cook. In 1940, she was a seamstress at the WPA workshop. Living with her were her son, Sylvester Martin, and her grandson, Willie Rae Cephas. Died of coronary thrombosis.

Cephas, Anna Belle (Brown) 9 April 1914-19 Dec 1994 Born to Johnny & Willie (Green) Brown

Cephas, Cora Willie (Brady) 14 Oct 1889-13 Jan 1975 (85) Born to Webb & Alice (Lawshe) Brady. Married to Ulysses Cephas. Laundress. Died of cerebral vascular accident.

Cephas, Eliza "Lizzie" 18 Apr 1887-12 Mar 1923 Born to Joe & Elizabeth (Allen) Cephas

Cephas, Elizabeth Anne (Allen) 1852-2 Jun 1932 Born a slave. Married to Joe Cephas who became the blacksmith for the enterprises on Thompson's Island. Joe had come as a slave in 1852 from the New Orleans slave market. Sarah Burleson had asked William Thompson to purchase a blacksmith there for her. He paid \$800 for Joe. Elizabeth was part Native American. She was a cook.

Cephas, Emancer 20 Aug 1891-23 Mar 1908

Cephas, Galilee 16 Mar 1877-26 Jun 1912 Born to Joe & Elizabeth (Allen) Cephas. After Joe disappeared, their son, Galilee, looked after the family until he was killed in 1912.

Cephas, Ulysses "Boots"

13 Jun 1884-13 Jun 1952

Born to Joseph & Elizabeth (Allen) Cephas. Married Cora Willie Brady. Well-known San Marcos blacksmith, working first in John E. Morris's smithy. He then partnered in 1923 with Anthony Giles and bought A. M. Ramsay's property at 224 South Guadalupe Street. Ulysses was a fine musician, teaching himself to play several instruments by ear. He organized the 45-member San Marcos Independent Band. He acted as a go-between for the Klu Klux Klan and San Marcos' African American population. Died of cardiac failure.

Cephas, Ulysses F. Jr. 23 Sep 1912-13 Dec 1912 Born to Ulysses & Cora Willie (Brady) Cephas.

Cephas, Wilbur 17 Jan 1914- 26 Oct 1914 Was he a twin of Willie Glen Cephas?

Cephas, Willie Glen 17 Jan 1914-30 Apr 1962

Born to Ulysses & Cora Willie (Brady) Cephas. Married. Blacksmith Died of uremia.

Cephas, Willie Ray 5 Jan 1939-14 Feb 1983 Born to Willie Cephas & Emma J (Blocker or Carver). Lovie (Farmer) Martin Carver was his grandmother.

Cheatham, Barbara Jane (Thompson) 14 Dec 1934-Feb 1984 Born in Lockhart, Caldwell County, to Clifton & Edna (Johnson) Thompson. Married to Oscar Douglas Cheatham

Cheatham, Coleman 12 Jan 1903-17 Aug 1968 Born to Milton & Fishie (Durham) Cheatham. By 1920, living with younger brother, Milton, at Lockhart with mother (34) and stepfather, Will B. Williams (23). Employed on his stepfather's farm. Married/Divorced. Died of bronchio-pneumonia after operation for a carcinoma.

Cheatham, Dora Martin (Nance) 14 Jul 1894-13 Dec 1978 Born to Louis & Leatha Ann (Martin) Nance. Married to Eugene Cheatham. In 1940, the pair living with Emma Brown (described as her son-in-law) in San Marcos. Dora was a janitress in a post office. Died of cerebral thrombosis.

Cheatham, Eugene Cliett

10 Apr 1891-1 October 1965

Born to Mose & Mahalay (Lawshe) Cheatham. Married to Dora Nance. In 1940, hotel porter in San Marcos. Retired hotel attendant, friend of President Johnson while attending college in San Marcos. Working as a bootblack for Vaughan Nesbitt, San Marcos, when he enlisted in the US Army in WWI. Served as a wagoner with Co A 341 Service Battalion in France — character described as "very good." Died of acute myocardial infraction.

Cheatham, Helen 22 Sep 1913-3 May 1914 Born To Lonnie & Ada (Giles) Cheatham.

Cheatham, Horace "Army" 15 Apr 1888-16 May 1936 Born to Mose & Mahalay (Lawshe) Cheatham. Never married. Laborer at a cotton compress for 20 years. Died of acute hepatitis.

Was a head baker, along with her sister, Hattie Nell Mack, at the San Marcos Baptist Academy. She would rise at 4 a.m. and walk to the Academy, often taking her daughter, Ora Jean (Odams) Young who later became one of San Marcos' most celebrated bakers.

Cheatham, Lola G. (Hardeman) 12 Aug 1910-2 Sep 1996 Born in Caldwell County to E. J. & Johana (Steward) Hardeman. Married to Tommie L. Cheatham.

Cheatham, Lonnie

Oct 1893-3 Aug 1937 Born to Mose & Mahalay (Lawshe) Cheatham. Married to Ada (Harris) Giles in 1913

Cheatham, Louis 27 Aug 1884-10 May 1951 Born to Mose & Mahalay (Lawshe) Cheatham. Married to Faye. Was a porter. Died of heart failure.

Cheatham, Mahalay (Lawshe) Mar 1863- 16 May 1927 Born a slave in Alabama to Ed & Martha (Hopkins) Lawshe. Married to Mose Cheatham in 1881. Was chief cook at the Goforth Hotel. She also ran a laundry servicel She was "a fine cook... a good woman, loved and respected by whites as well as blacks," according to the San Marcos Record 05/20/1927. Died of mitral regurgitation. Her funeral was one of the biggest African American funerals in San Marcos.

Cheatham, Milton Jr. 12 Feb 1905-10 Jun 1970 Born to Milton & Tishia (Durham) Williams Cheatham Sr. Married 1928 Mary Lucille "Red Mama" Beard. Died of a heart attack.

Cheatham, Mishion (Taylor)

15 Jul 1870-13 May 1936

Born to Peter Taylor who was brought by Dr. Connell from Missouri and sold to Dr. Hunter for whom the town of Hunter is named. Mishion grew up on the Hunter farm in Stringtown. In 1920, her daughter Lettie (Cheatham) McQueen and grandsons, Laurence McQueen and Lucious G* were living with her. Shares stone with her grandson, Laurence McQueen.

Cheatham, Mose

1859-1924

Born a slave to Thomas & Frances Cheatham. Married to Mahalay Lawshe. He was a carriage driver then later had a two-horse cab. He was known as Peg-leg Mose because he lost a leg in an accident with his carriage. Full of passengers, it had started to slip on a hill, slick from recent rains. When the brakes failed to engage, Mose ran round the back attempting to stop the carriage. He was knocked down and his leg crushed. Yet he continued to meet the trains and hauled passengers to the hotels and other parts of town until his passing a few years before 1949.

Cheatham, Oscar Douglas

8 May 1922-27 Jan 1967

Nathaniel Pleasant, then reverted to the name of her first and best loved husband, Fred Giles. Employed for 23 years as the accountant at the San Marcos Baptist Academy then, stemming from her love of genealogy and history, founded A.C.T.O.R.S (Ancestry Chart Tracing, Ollie's Research Services). Very active in San Marcos, Ollie served on several boards and auxiliaries and as head usher at Jackson Chapel United Methodist Church. Member of Hays County Historical Commission, Cemetery Preservation Board, and the Genealogy Society. Active in the rediscovery of Kyle Old Slave Cemetery, she had the name officially changed to the Kyle Family Pioneer Cemetery. Received Bachelors degree from Sam Houston State University and Masters from Texas A & M University. Taught in Buda, Centerpoint, Luling and San Marcos, retiring in 1972. Opened a Black kindergarten prior to integration. After the schools were integrated, San Marcos CISD accepted Black students, but not the Black teachers, so it took a law suit before Katherine became the first African American teacher to be hired by them. Served on City of San Marcos Board of Directors and City of San Marcos Zoning and Planning Committee. Inducted into San Marcos Hall of Fame. Named in 'Who's Who in Texas" and invited to appear on "Good Morning America." Met Pres Lyndon Johnson at the White House. Received the Lizzy Grant Award, member of NAACP, Carver Court of Colanthe and Heroines of Jericho.

Haynes, Sue E. (Cheatham) 31 Dec 1937-8 Aug 1995 Born to Tommie L. & Lola G (Hardeman) Cheatham.

Heard, Enola George (Hollins) 19 Sep 1912-23 Jan 1999 Born to George Mose & Etta Lee (Fuller) Hollins. Married to 1) Lawrence Charles Hargis. 2) ? Heard. Mother of Ollie (Hargis) Giles.

Heard, Lena Belle (Burleson) 21 Feb 1930-2010 Born to Willie Gaston & Willie Mae (Hardeman) Burleson. Attended Prairie View A&M and Peoples Business College in Austin. Married Isaiah Henry Heard and moved to Bloomington. Worked for 35 years for Bloomington Independent School District as administrative assistant, tax assessor collector, and payroll clerk and was a notary public. Died of pancreatic cancer.

Herring, Lou Ella 1910-1994 San Marcos school cafeteria employee. Sister of Alvin and Carlos Norwood.

Hicks, Wille A. Sr. 25 Nov 1940- 2 Sep 2009 Married to Janice Jackson.

Hill, Anna Marguerite (Cheatham)

9 Oct 1918- 30 Mar 2010

Born in Oklahoma City to Lonnie & Ada (Harris) Cheatham who moved to San Marcos when Anna was six months old. Married Tommy Lee Hill. Attended Huston-Tillotson University for three years. Held many offices in the Wesley Chapel A.M.E. Church which she represented for many years at the annual conference and was their historian. The church fellowship hall was renamed Lucille Cheatham-Marguerite Cheatham Hill Fellowship in honor of her and Mrs Lucille Cheatham. She worked for Southwest Texas State University for 20 years. Received the Lizzy Grant Award, Hall of Fame Award and Missionary Society Woman of the Year Award.

Participated in American Woodsmen #127, Order of the Eastern Star, Church Women United, Hays County extension, NAACP, Women of Wisdom and Carver Court of Calanthe #93.

Hodge, Andrew 7 May 1907- 2 Nov 1974 Born Guadalupe County to William & Elizabeth (Ussery) Hardge/Hodge. Divorced. Railroad maintenance worker. Died of cerebral vascular accident.

Hodge, Stella (Smiler) 9 March 1885-26 Feb1963 Born to John & Patsy (Gray) Smiler. Married to Tom L. Hodge. Died of pulmonary edema.

Hodge, William 6 Jul 1892-30 Jul 1951 Born Guadalupe County to A.M. Hodge. Married. Laborer. Died of broncho-pneumonia.

Holland, Kramer/Cramer Williams 1 Nov 1907-Dec 1981 Married to Rev. W. L. Holland, minister in a Protestant Church in Austin in 1950. Died in Houston.

Hollins, Arntie Edward

10 Apr 1916-7 Aug 1964

Born to Mose and Etta (Fuller) Hollins in San Marcos. Received B.A. & M.S. from Prairie View A. & M. College then pursued advanced studies at the University of Texas. Taught at Maxwell, Beaumont, and Orange before being employed by Temple Independent School District in 1956. He was a case worker for more than three years at Gatesville State School for Boys. At the time of death, was a school social worker at temple. In the US Army during WWII, remaining for a further five years afterwards, attaining rank of Chief Warrant Officer and cited for superior combat performance in Austria. He was Ollie Giles' uncle. Died of acute myocardial infarction.

Hollins, Etta Lee (Fuller) 7 March 1897- 1 Feb 1983 Born to Albert & Etta Fuller who were working on a farm in Guadalupe County, in 1910. Married to George Mose Hollins in 1912. Ollie Giles' grandmother.

Hollins, George Mose 7 Sep 1890-12 Dec1952 Born at Staples, Texas, to Mose & Melvina (Merriwether) Hollins. Married to Etta Lee Fuller. Wholesale grocery worker. A truck driver for Southern Grocery Company in 1918. The store produced "Old Mose Coffee" and put his picture on the bags and cans.

Hollins, Muart G. 18 Mar 1914-13 Jun 1979

Hooker, Leslie Lynn (Spears) 13 Feb 1963-16 Jun 2021 Born to Arvie James & Josie Nell (Mack) Spears. Married Larry Hooker. Received BA & MA in Sociology from South West Texas State University. Employed as an adjunct professor by Austin Community College then as an IT specialist by Ascension Information Services.

Horne, Sibyl Yvonne 20 Apr 1952-17 Apr 1981

Howard, Bernice (McHenry) 26 Sep 1921-19 Jul 1988 Born to Joe & Addie M. (Taylor) McHenry

Hudson, K Died 13 Sep 1910/1919 - stone almost illegible. She could be Kramer Hudson, daughter of Richard & Ellen Hudson who were farming near San Marcos in 1910. Richard was from the West Indies.

Humphrey, Thelma (Beard) 27 Aug 1905- 10 Nov 1985 Born to Joe & Mary Priscilla (Johns) Beard.

Hutson, Clarence Waymon Sr. 15 Dec 1937-29 Feb 2005 Born to Floyd Waymon & Mattie Lee (Edwards) Hutson. Served as an airman basic in the US Air Force.

Hutson, Clarence Waymon Jr. 11 Aug 1965-5 August 1976 Born in San Antonio to Clarence W. Hutson & Everlean (Mitchell) Hutson Sr. He was a schoolboy in San Antonio but died of accidental drowning when he fell into a swimming pool at 3, Niles Road, Austin. The house was built by Dr. John Calhoun who was the founder of what bis now St. David's Hospital. From 1967 to 1978, Robert C. Gray, a building contractor, owned the house and added the pool in which Clarence drowned.

Hutson, Floyd Waymon

23 Aug 1894- 5 Apr 1947

Married to Mattie Lee Edwards. Private Company C 415 Res Labor Bn WWI. In 1933 Sam Moore's Gulf Station advertised that they had hired Floyd, an experienced car washer and polisher. In 1935, he and C.B. Traywick organized a celebration to observe the 70th anniversary of President Lincoln's emancipation proclamation. He was a popular musician in San Marcos, playing the piano in his minstrel band. His son, William R. "Bill" Hutson, became an internationally known artist.

Hutson, Mattie Lee (Edwards) 19 Feb 1913-29 Mar 1952 Born to Will & Maggie (Spears) Edwards. Married to Floyd Waymon Hutson. She was employed as a maid. Died of a pulmonary embolism after an incisional hernia repair.

Jackson, Clay Eulah (Johns) 24 Jun 1911-22 Jan 1966 Born to Sergeant & Mattie Cerdet (Hays) Johns.. Married to Hayes Jackson. A cook in Corpus Christi when she died of a coronary occlusion.

Jackson, Erna (Chapman) 4 Jan 1914 - 23 Sep 2000 Married to Walter Eugene Jackson Sr.

Jackson, Gertie (Jefferson) 24 January 1905- 22 Mar 1972 Born to Louis & Fannie (Jefferson) Jackson. Divorced. Died in intestinal obstruction.

Jackson, Louis

6 Aug 1909-20 July 1928

Born to Louis & Fannie (Jefferson) Jackson. Single. Laborer. Died of tertiary syphilis.

Jackson, Lucious Brown Sr.

1915-1981

Born to Frank & Frances Mae (Bunton) Jackson. Married and divorced Mattie Ellen Greenwood. Corporal US Army WWII. His son, Lucius Brown Jackson Jr, at 6' 9" tall, played basketball for the Philadelphia 76's and represented Pan American College and the USA at the 1964 Olympics when the basketball team won a gold medal.

Jackson, Mattie Ellen (Greenwood) 8 Jun 1914–4 Jul 1968

Born to Robert & Laura (Phillips) Greenwood. Married and divorced Lucius Brown Jackson Sr. Their son, Lucius Brown Jackson Jr. was 6' 9" tall and became a well-known basketball player with the Philadelphia 76's and was a member of the US basketball team who won a gold medal at the 1964 Tokyo Olympics. Mattie worked as a maid at SouthWest Texas University. died of a heart attack. On stone with her mother, Laura Phillips.

Jackson, Samuel 28 Sep 1914- 13 Jan 1968 Born to Louis & Fannie (Jefferson) Jackson. Married 1906 Georgie Newman. Laborer. Died of coronary occlusion.

Jackson, Samuel Warren

5 Apr 1937-28 Jan 2001

Born to Samuel & Alean (Giles) Jackson. Reared by his grandparents, Anthony & Aa Giles, and his aunt, Marguerite (Cheatham) Hill. Spent many years at Walton House, San Marcos, learning living skills and participated in the Special Olympics (winning many medals for wheelchair racing) and American Habilitation Learning Resource Center Programs.

Jackson, Walter Eugene Jr. 10 Sep 1936-30 Jun 2011 Born to Walter Eugene Sr. & Erna (Chapman) Jackson

Jefferson, Scott 9 Jan 1884-23 Jun 1926 Born to Sam & Emma (Miller) Jefferson. Married to. Laborer Died of pulmonary tuberculosis.

Johns, Ike 16 Apr 1855—3 Jul 1932 Born a slave to Zack & Sallie Ann (Holland) Rucker. Married Lillie Langdon. Farmer. Died of uremia.

Johns, J. C. 10 Oct 1854—30 Mar 1893 Born a slave

Johns, Lillie (Langdon) 8 Dec 1866- 15 Mar 1951 Born to James Walter & Ruth Langdon Sr. Married to Ike Johns. Died of cancer of the breast.

Johns, Mary P. (Mosby) 15 Jun 1875-10 Jan 1954 Born to Litha Mosby. Died of chronic myocarditis

Johns, Thad Davis 29 Jan 1904-9 Sep 1963 Born to Nelson & Hattie (Brown) Johns. Married Zantie Ophelia Mitchell. Owner of a gas station. Died near his service station when shot by Neff Johnson of Lovelady, Texas.

Johns, Zantie Ophelia (Mitchell) 14 Jun 1907 - 6 Feb 1987 Married to Thad Davis Johns

Johnson, Gary Zane 19 Jan 1954-22 Dec 1954 Born to Neff & Emma (Byas) Johnson. Died of virus pneumonia and infant diarrhea.

Johnson. Ludie (Davis) 25 Jul 1913-7 Oct 1940 Born to Dan & Lucile (McHenry) Davis Miller. Married. Died in San Antonio of a diabetic coma.

Johnson, Mary 2 Dec 1879-12 Mar 1971

Johnson, Neff Morris 2 Mar 1921-24 Sep 2007 Born in Lovelady, Houston, to Sam & Viola (Griffen) Johnson. Married 1. Emma Pearl Calhoun (divorced 1968) 2. Katie M. Brown (divorced). 3. Emma Byas (married 2000). Worked for Union Pacific Railroad as gang foreman/assistant superintendent. Served in the US Navy in WWII. Shot and killed Thad D. Johns in 1963. Was himself shot by Mary Ann Burleson in 1971, but survived.

Judson, Richard Circa 1857-22 Sep 1917 Born a slave.

Kerr, Earlie Jane (Thomson) 27 Nov 1892-7 Aug 1954. Born to Robert & Caroline (Myers) Thomson. Married to George Washington Kerr. Died of myocardial infarction.

Kerr, George Washington 26 Apr 1874-4 Sep 1966 Born in Caldwell county to Robert and Ann Kerr. Married to Earlie Jane Thomson. Moved to San Marcos in 1907. Employed as a trucker by Moore Grocery company. He was the first person in Hays County to receive Social Security benefits. Deacon at First Colored Baptist Church where he taught Sunday school. Died of chronic myocarditis.

Keys, Hazel (Smith) 6 Feb 1943-15 Dec 1997 Born to Mamie Louise Smith. In 1950, living with her grandparents, Nelson and Lizzie Smith and her divorced mother, Mamie (Smith) Grey (later Mrs. M.C. Mack) and three Grey siblings.

Kilgore, Tol Jr. 25 Oct 1921-31 Dec 1921 Born to Tol & Maude Eve (Osborn) Kilgore Sr. Died of purpura, resulting from improper feeding.

Kirk, Albert Walker 20 Sep 1942-7 Aug 1976 Born to Robert William & Annie Corean (Walker) Kirk. Married to Katie Mae Brown and Patricia. Sgt. First Class US Army in Vietnam where he died on active duty.

Kirk, Annie Corean (Walker) 3 Aug 1902-10 March 1961 Born Guadalupe County to Josh & Leola (Ratliff) Walker. Married to Robert William Kirk. Maid at SouthWest Texas University. Died of myocardial infarction.

Kirk, Bobbie (Brooks) 1906-9 Oct 1988 Married to John T. "Buddy" Kirk. Proprietor of a Colored cafe on Comal Street in 1850. President of No. 1 Circle at Bethel Baptist Church.

Kirk, Elmer 10 Sep 1902-8 Oct 1975 Born Staples, Guadalupe County, to Sam & Maud (Walker) Kirk. Married and divorced. Laborer. Died of cerebral vascular accident.

Kirk, John T. "Buddy" 13 Mar 1900-21 Aug 1974 Born Staples, Guadalupe County, to Lee & Kate (Gray) Kirk. Married to Bobbie Kirk. Died of carcinoma of the lung.

Kirk, Robert William 3 Apr 1893-2 Dec 1965 Born to Will & Nora (Smith) Kirk. Married to Annie Corean Walker. Farmer. Corporal in Company D 531 Engineering Battalion in WWI. Lived in San Antonio.

Kyle, Augustus George 18 Mar 1915-13 Jul 1987 Bon to Polk & Georgia (Barnes) Kyle. Married 1. Irene Millet -divorced. 2. Minnie ?. TEC 3 US Army WWII. Augustus's memories of the lost location of the Kyle Old Slave Cemetery (Kyle Family Pioneer Cemetery) led to its rediscovery. He is also listed as Augustus George Warren.

Kyle, Bessie (Coleman) 7 Jun 1881- 4 Dec1971 Born in Milam County to Sam & Susie Craft Coleman. Married to George Kyle. Died of cerebral thromboses.

Kyle, Ed 23 Dec 1882-29 Oct 1960 Born to Sam & Viney Kyle. Married to Mary Barnett. Road maintenance machinery operator. Living in Beeville, Bee County, when he died of carcinoma of the prostate.

Kyle, Fannie B. (Shaw) 6 Oct 1909-13 Apr 1980 Married 1934 to Sidney Green Kyle Sr.

Kyle, George 26 September 1876-7 Sep 1970 Born to Tom & Lou (Rector) Kyle. Married to Bessie Coleman. Farmer. Died of arteriosclerotic heart disease.

Kyle, Hardy Clifton 28 Nov 1913-3 Jul 1976 Born to Polk & Georgia (Barnes) Kyle. TEC 4 US Army WWII. Civil servant with the City of Austin. Died in Austin of cardiorespiratory arrest.

Kyle, Lloyd Clinton Sr 23 May 1940-21 Dec 2003 Born to Lloyd Lee & Louise (Miller) Kyle. Married and divorced Bettye Jean Holland.

Kyle, Lloyd Lee 10 August 1905-15 May 1967 Born to Polk & Georgia (Barnes) Kyle. Married 1924 Louise Miller. In 1940 was a truck driver for a wholesale grocery. A janitor for 22 years in San Marcos Post Office. Died of coronary occlusion.

Kyle, Louise (Miller) 29 Dec 1906-1 Apr 1984 Married to Lloyd Lee Kyle in 1924. A housemaid in 1950.

Kyle, Lucille (Stiles) 19 Sep 1917-19 Apr 1985 Born to Clara Stiles. Married to Hardy Clinton Kyle. With husband Harvey owned popular eating place, The Grill.

Kyle, Mayme Teresa 10 Dec 1908 - 12 Jan 1984 Born to Polk Rogers & Georgia (Barnes) Kyle. May have been married to a Mr. Warren. Graduate of Prairie View A & M. Was a public-school teacher in Borger, San Marcos, Maxwell & Kyle, Texas. Sat on Governor's Council on Human Relations. Latterly living with her brother, Augustus George Kyle, at 213 Shady Lane, San Marcos.

Kyle, Margaret (Brown) 19 Sep 1879-27 Feb 1909. Born and died in Caldwell County. Married to William Kyle.

Kyle, Mary (Barnett) 1871-1938 Born to Richmond & Jane (Glover) Barnett. Married to Ed Kyle. Died of a streptococcal blood stream infection — strep throat.

Kyle, Nora Lillie 1889-8 Jan 1984 Polk Kyle's third wife — married by 1950

Kyle, Pauline 2 Jan 1902-6 Feb 1916 Born to Polk & Georgia (Barnes) Kyle. Single. No cause of death given.

Kyle, Polk 26 Sep 1876-13 Apr 1951 Born to Sam & Viney (Newman) Kyle . Married 1. 1901 Georgia Barnes. 2. 1917 Sara Adams 3. Nora Liillie? Fireman at an oil mill in 1910. "*Courteous porter*" at the San Marcos Post Office

where he worked as custodian for almost 30 years. Polk owned a ranch three miles north of San Marcos. His son, Augustus, killed a 4½'rattlesnake there in June 1939. Polk died of heart failure.

Kyle, Robert Sr. Circa 1843-10 Apr 1914 Born a slave in Mississippi. Married to Phillis Hartfield. in 1870, farm laborer, listed in census next to Ezekial Nance, southwest of Kyle. A farmer.

Kyle, Sara (Adams) Aug 1880-16 May 1940 Born to Charles & Sallie (Yancy) Adams. Divorced by 1910 from Charles H. Robinson/ Robertson. Became second wife of Polk Kyle in 1917. Died of cardio-renal disease.

Kyle, Sidney Green Sr. 10 May 1903 -3 Mar 2000 Born to Polk & Georgia (Barnes) Kyle. Married to Fannie B. Shaw. Janitor at a post office in 1950. Died in Houston.

Kyle, Sidney Green Jr. 23 Nov 1936-23 May 2020 Born to Sidney Green & Fannie B. (Shaw) Kyle Sr. Attended Texas Southwestern University in Houston. On 24 June 1960, Sidney was on board US Coast Guard Lightship Relief when, in thick fog, it was struck and sunk by the SS Green Bay soon after leaving Port Newark, New Jersey. He was rescued from an inflatable raft by the SS Green Bay. Worked at Texas State University until retirement.

Kyle, William "Will" 28 Mar 1878-24 Nov 1929 Born to Sam & Viney (Newman) Kyle who are buried in the Kyle Old Slave Cemetery (now Kyle Family Pioneer Cemetery). Married 1906 Margaret Brown who died in 1909 and is buried in the Brite Cemetery, Caldwell County. Laborer. Will died of mitral regurgitation.

Landa, Henry 19 Feb 1878-31 Jan 1938 Born in New Braunfels to Isaiah & Lula (Coleman) Landa. Married to Lizzie Smith. Had a grocery store in San Marcos. Died of a gunshot wound to the head.

Landa, Lizzie (Smith) 1 Apr 1880-16 Feb 1949 Born to Tom & Ella (Brady) Smith. Married to Henry Landa. Died of bronchial asthma.

Langdon, James Walter Sr. 25 Dec 1844 -4 Jul 1930 Born a slave in North Carolina. Married Ruth. Farmer. In 1872, he was listed as owning 15 acres in T J Chambers League. An original trustee of the San Marcos and Blanco Association Cemetery.

Langdon, James Walter Jr. 14 Dec 1874-19 Jan 1955 Born to James Walter & Ruth Langdon Sr. Married to Lucille Norwood. In 1880, he (farm servant) and Lucy (servant) were living in the household of H.C. Storey, a farmer. Farming on his own account when he died of carcinoma of the liver.

Langdon, Lucille "Lucy" (Norwood) 20 April 1877-10 April 1960 Born to Neal & Mary (John) Norwood. Married 1896 James Walter Langdon Jr. Died of congestive failure from cardio-renal disease.

Langdon, Ruth 28 Jan 1830-21 Apr 1905. Born as a slave in North Carolina. Married to James Walter Langdon Sr. In the 1880 census, Ruth is recorded as an invalid. Routh (sic) Langdon has another older but quite impressive gravestone which had been broken in half but pieced together again. It gives her birthdate as 1824 but her death as April 1905 like the one she shares with her husband, James Langdon.

Lawshe, Byrd Lorraine 7 Aug 1916-8 Nov 1939 Born to Lee & Mary (Barnes) Lawshe. Single. A beauty operator in a beauty parlor at time of death from a coronary clot following an appendectomy.

Lawshe, Lee Anderson 22 Sep 1863-11 Aug 1933 Born to Edward & Martha (Hawkins) Lawshe. Married 1908 to Mary Ann Barnes.

Lawshe, Martha Benny (Hawkins)

May 1829-17 Jul 1933

Born a slave in Mississippi to James Madison Hawkins (named for his father's classmate at college, later Pres. Madison) and a slave, Mahalia. Martha was one of his two children by a slave, Mahalia. Married Ed Tom Lawshe (son of Lewis Madison Lawshe). According to her father's will, she was left in the custody of his niece, Georgia Lawshe Woods, wife of Col. Dr. Peter Woods. Martha is featured in Janice Woods 8's book, *True Women*, and played by Salli Richardson-Whitfield in the subsequent TV miniseries. Died of senile gangrene of the legs.

Littlejohn, Jewell D. (Edwards) 15 Sep 1911-9 Nov 1995 Born to Will & Maggie (Spears) Edwards.

Love, Arthur Sr. 4 Jan 1876-25 Sep 1956 Born to Fred & Sophia (Edgar) Love. Married Annie Mae Searcy. Annie Mae is buried at Skyview Cemetery, death due to a coronary embolism caused by premature labor. Arthur was working at W.E. Hoch Grocery Store when he died of a cerebral hemorrhage.

Love, Arthur Jr. 11 Apr 1928-8 Sep 1950 Born to Arthur & Annie Mae (Searcy) Love Sr. He shone shoes at Parlor Barber Shop before enlisting in the US Army as a private in 24th Infantry Division in Korea where he was killed in action. His body was returned for final burial in this cemetery. In his honor, San Marcos City Council renamed Minton Street, where Arthur had lived, Love Street.

Love, Florence Died 18 Dec 1907 (age 3 ?) Florence's stone stands beside that of Arthur Love Sr.

Luck, Dorothy. Oct 1899 -18 Mar 1918

Born to Charles & Lottie (Martin) Luck.

Luck, Edna A Mar 1895-25 April 1917 Born to Charles & Lottie (Martin) Luck.

Luck, Wylie A. 12 Aug 1885 -5 Jul 1913 Born to Charles & Lottie (Martin) Luck. A porter when he died in El Paso of hemorrhage from tuberculosis. Married to Hattie Jones.

McHenry, Alberta (Taylor) 13 Aug 1896-5 Nov 1973 Born to Peter & Eliza (Embry) Taylor. Married to McHenry. Died of myocardial infarction and carcinoma of the lung.

McHenry, Joe 1 Apr 1888-1923 Born in Seguin. Married in 1917 to Addie May Taylor. Served as private in US Army in WWI.

McHenry, Lloyd 11 Jul 1916-27 Aug 1937 Born to Tex & Alberta (Taylor) McHenry. Single. Farmer. Died of typhoid fever.

McHenry, Tex 4 Mar 1894-24 Nov 1934 Born Guadalupe County to Gus & Josephine (Greenwood) McHenry. Married Alberta Taylor. Farmer. Living in Grandview, Texas, when he died of carcinoma of sigmoid colon.

McKinney, Roscoe Burleson 14 Feb 1906-11 Sep 1943 Radio technician who operated a radio repair shop on East Hopkins, San Marcos. Prior to that he lived in Martindale.

McMillon, Erma Lee 9 Oct 19**- 2 Dec192*

McMillon, Mary Feb 1876-10 Dec 1951 Burned to death in her home on East Hopkins Street

McQueen, Laurence

4 Sep 1902 - 25 Mar 1941

Born to Charley & Lettie (Cheatham) McQueen. Married 1924 Alma Kyle. In 1910, little Lawrence and his divorced mother, Lettie Cheatham, were listed as servants living in Canadian-born, widowed Alice Garth's boarding house in San Marcos. In 1920, living with his grandmother, Mishion (Taylor) Cheatham and his mother, Lettie. Listed as a porter when he died of tubercular meningitis. Shares a stone with his grandmother, Mishion (Taylor) Cheatham.

Laurence McQueen was also the grandson of Luckey & Hester (Brooks) McQueen, and great-grandson of Ketch (Catch) & Ann McQueen. Luckey and his parents (all born slaves) had come to Hays County from Louisiana. In the 1870s, Lucky and his father, Ketch, were farm laborers, probably share croppers, on the Stringtown farm of legislator and attorney, Major William Oscar Hutchison. In 1879, Ketch, a trustee of the first Colored Baptist Church Zion near Purgatory Creek, and Luckey used as collateral for loans from Major Hutchison, two

mules, a horse, harness, wagon, farm implements, and their cotton and corn crops on the major's farm. In 1881, Luckey, a preacher, was a trustee of the Colored Missionary Baptist church. In 1893, he was one of four original trustees of San Marcos and Blanco Association who purchased 10.62 acres from Major Hutchison and his wife Leonora for this cemetery for African Americans.

Mack, Hattie Nell (Myers) 5 June 1916-20 March 1999 Born San Marcos to Tommy & Nellie Irene (Brady) Myers. Married to Horace Mack. Along with her sister, Josephine Cheatham, was a head baker at San Marcos Academy. They would rise at 4 a.m. and walk there every morning, often accompanied by Josephine's daughter, Ora Jean, who later became one of San Marcos' most famous bakers. Mack, M.C. 25 June 1917-Died 11 Aug 1978 Born to Ollie & Marty Ellen (Crooks) Mack. Married to Mamie Smith in 1954. Retired from US Air Force (Served 1942-1965). Died of widely disseminated carcinomatosis of renal cell carcinoma.

Mack, Mamie Louise (Smith) Grey 20 May 1925-19 Feb 2002 Born to Nelson & Lizzie G. Smith. Married M. C. Mack in 1954. In 1950, divorced and living with her parents and her four children with the surname, Smith. She was dish washer at a state college.

Mackey, Robert Oct 1884-25 May 1926 Born to Edmund & Susan Ann (Maryweathers) Mackey. In 1900, in Guadalupe County where father was farming. In 1910 in Temple, Bell County, where he, brother and father were laborers.

Mackey, Susan Ann (Maryweathers) Circa 1867-15 Jan 1921 Born Guadalupe County to Squire & Melvina (Strong). Married Edmund Mackey. In 1900, in Guadalupe County. In 1910, in Temple, Bell County .Died in Austin of gastritis.

Majors, Annie (Hardeman) 12 Mar 1894-14 Dec 1956 Born to William & Jennie B. Hardeman. Married 1912 Norman Majors. Died of cerebral thrombosis.

Majors, Lelo (Washington) 8 Jun 1898-27 Oct 1960 Born to Henry & Texanna Washington. Married 1958 as second wife of Norman Majors who had a slight stroke just before being married on Lelo's porch. Member of Heroines of Jericho Died of chronic myocarditis.

Manning, Demettria Lashe 16 Sep 1967-20 Apr 2005 Born to Forest Gilbert & Pearlie Mae (Cephas) Manning

Manning, Frederick Lawrence 25 Oct 1973-19 Feb 2021 Born to Forrest Gilbert & Pearlie Mae (Cephas) Manning.

Manning, Pearlie Mae (Cephas)

8 Jan 1939-6 Jan 2006 Born to Anna Belle (Brown) Cephas. Married Forrest Gilbert Manning, divorced 1986.

Martin, Sylvester

26 Oct 1913-24 Feb 1977

Born Kyle to Thomas James & Lovie Mae (Farmer) Martin. His stepmother was Ida Martin. Listed as single in 1950 but married on death certificate. Construction worker. In 1940, living with his mother, Lovie Mae (Farmer) Carver, and employed as a cotton compressor in San Marcos. That year Sylvester was arrested for stealing guns from Talmadge Store, San Marcos. In 1970 was in Corpus Christi. Died of hepatic inefficiency.

Melton, Irene (Millett) Bibbs

10 Dec 1917-6 Jan 2006

Born in Guadalupe County to Waco & Annie Lee (Holland) Millett. Married 1) Augustus Kyle 2) Leon Bibbs 3) Luke Melton. Employed at Southwest Texas State University for 28 years. Member of San Marcos' First Baptist Church Missionary Society and faithful member of Heroines of Jericho, Courts of Calanthe, and Woodsmen.

Metters, Leola D. 12 Jan 1910-30 Aug 1973 Born to Louis & Willie (Ellis) Dennis. Married 1929 Taft Metters Sr. Died of carcinomatosis.

Metters, Taft, Sr 23 Mar 1911-12 Feb 1966 Born to Robert & Elinora (Wade) Metters. Married 1929 to Leola Dennis. Working in a restaurant at 650 Calhoun, Fort Worth, when he died of a gunshot wound

Miles, Margaret Nell (Jackson) 7 Sep 1941-8 Jan 2019 Born to Samuel & Alean (Giles) Jackson. Married 1968 King David Miller

Miller, Baby No dates

Miller, Homer 1903-5 Nov 1918 Born Caldwell County to Isaiah & Ellen (Robert) Miller. A schoolboy, he died of pneumonia as a result of the Spanish influenza.

Miller, Katie Circa1864-5 Dec 1918 Divorced from Cay (?) Miller. In 1910, her daughters, Annie Johns (and daughter Marie), Rosie Johnson (and children, L.D., Wilbert, Katie and Edna), and son Goldie living with her. Her daughters were laundresses and son a laborer

Miller, Pearl D, 26 Jul 1889-26 Feb 1966 Born in Austin to unknown parents. Married to Virgil Miller. Died of uremia.

Miller, Virgil 26 Aug 1887-13 May 1971 Born to Isihac & Ellen (Roberts) Miller. Married to Pearl. Served as private in US Army Company K 367 Infantry in WWI.

Miller, Willie 3 Dec 1894-17 July 1987 Working for Irwin Rylander, San Marcos, in 1917. Divorced. In 1940 he was a cook in a San Marcos hotel, living with his cousin, Ed Jackson. By 1950, living on his own, but still a cook.

Millett, Annie Lee (Holland) 30 May 1898-8 Mar 1998 Born DeWitt County to Walter & Willie Ward (Mulkey) Holland but moved to New Braunfels. Attended Guadalupe College in Seguin. Married 1916 Waco Millett and had one child, Irene. They moved to San Marcos in the 1920s.

Millett, Waco 22 Sep 1892-15 Nov 1966 Married to Annie Lee Holland. Employed by the Yarrington family for 29 years.

Mitchell, Alma (Kyle) 1902-19 May 1983 Born to George & Bessie (Coleman) Kyle. Widowed and living with her parents in 1950 when she was a maid at a gas distribution office.

Mitchell, Alvin J. 2 Apr 1881-31 Oct 1968 Born to Ben Mitchell. Was a brakeman on a railroad. Died of auricular fibulation.

Mitchell, Ben Circa 1849 -29 Apr 1912 Born a slave.

Moore, Burl Circa 1879 - ? Born to Columbus & Ellen (Watkins) Moore. Married to Florence Tolliver. Stone sunk in ground obscuring dates.

Moore, Ellen 16 Oct 1853-15 June 1933 Born a slave to Henry & Melindy WatkIns. Married 1876 to Columbus Moore. Died of cerebral hemorrhage. On stone with Mary and Tommie Thompson - sunken so dates not visible.

Moore, Florence (Tolliver) 1890-Married 1917 Burl Moore — stone sunk in ground obscuring dates.

Moore, John 14 Mar 1900-24 Jun 1969 Born to John & Emma (Calvin) Moore. Married. Janitor working for the San Marcos Record. Died of carcinoma of the prostate.

Moore, Stella 24 Jan 1903- 28 Dec 1986 Married 1924 Robert Moore. In 1940, laundress living with daughters, Mattie Patterson and Esta Mae Moore and son, Robert Moore.

Myers, Tommie Frances 12 Apr 1914-16 Dec 1993

Born Tommy & Nellie Irene (Brady) Myers.

Newman, Mary 26 Aug 1879-10 Aug ?

Norwood, Alvin Floyd Jr. Oct 1942-Apr 1944 Born in San Antonio to Alvin Floyd & Lillie Mae (Smith) Norwood Sr. Died in San Marcos of broncho-pneumonia.

Norwood, Carlos 1918- 1 Sep 1981 Brother of Alvin Norwood Sr., Lou Ellas Herring and Ellie Jackson.

Norwood, Jettye Vernice 23 Feb 1913-14 May 1944 Born to Albert & Bettie (Evans) Norwood. Listed as single but she did have a child by Edward Harris. Employed as a maid. Died in the Kerrville State Sanatorium of pulmonary tuberculosis.

Norwood, Vera Lee 1 May 1917-17 Nov 1934

Odems, Jane Circa 1836 -22 Dec 1909 Born a slave. On stone with Addie B. Smith and three infants dated 14 Dec 1912, 15 Oct 1913, 6 Nov 1914 — see Addie B. Smith

Patterson, James 22 Sep 1899- 26 May1991 Born to Glenna Jackson. Married to Ora Lee Davis. Living with his mother in 1950. He was janitor in a bake shop.

Patterson, Ora Lee (Davis) 2 Apr 1902-16 Sep 1970 Born in Yoakum to Will & Diana (Mosle)y Davis. Married to James Patterson. Lived in San Antonio. Employed as a maid. Died in San Antonio of arterioschlerotic heart disease.

Peterson, Davian Yavel 12 March 1978- 28 July 2015 Born to David & Evelyn Denise (McWilliams - Harris) Peterson. Started a commercial cleaning business just before his death.

Phillips, Ellen 8 Jun 1896-26 Aug 1962 Born to Spencer & Laura (Graves) Phillips. Single. Employed as a maid by the Henderson family for 25 years. Died of congestive heart failure due to syphilitic aortitis with aneurysm.

Phillips, Laura H. 11 Mar 1890-31 Jun 1965 Born to Spenc, er & Laura (Graves) Phillips. Married. Died of myocardial infarction. On stone with daughter Mattie Jackson.

Pounds Maggie 1882-19 Nov 1947

Married to Steve Pounds. Died of a cerebral hemorrhage.

Pounds, Walter Clarence 4 July 1908-13 Jul 1954 Born to Steve & Maggie (Wade) Pounds. Married to Clarice Smith. Compress worker in Corpus Christi when he died of shock from six knife wounds. Assailant unknown.

Pullins, Moses 7 Aug 1896-23 Apr 1970 Born to Frank & Mae Belle (Franklin) Pullins. Married 1918 to Rosa Horton. A laborer. Died of cerebro-vascular hemorrhage.

Ramsey, Andrew 1 Mar 1870-26 June 1932 Born to John Ramsay. Married 1897 Roda Session. In 1920, Andrew was proprietor of a restaurant on Center Street, San Marcos. Died of internal obstruction due to hernia of intestine then mesentery.

Ramsay, Rhoda Feb 1880-3 April 1948 Born to John & Emma (Day) Session. Married 1897 Andrew Ramsay. Was a cook to a private family. Died of coronary occlusion.

Ramsey, Velma (Lawshe)

2 Mar 1911-22 Sep 1974

Born to Lee & Mary (Barnes) Lawshe. Foster mother was Mrs Dora Brady. Married 1936 Willie Ramsay. In 1950, pastry cook at the state college. Died of cardiac arrhythmia and myocardial infarction.

Ramsay, Willie 28 Dec 1911-20 Aug 1948 Born to Andrew & Rhoda (Session) Ramsay. Willie married 1936 Velma Lawshe. 1n 1950 was a press operator in a tailor's shop. Died of pulmonary hemorrhage from bronchial asthma.

Reagie, Mercile (Kirk) 26 Mar 1927-3 Aug 1983 Born to Robert William & Annie Corean (Walker) Kirk. Lived in San Antonio.

Reese, Deloria Bell "Pumpkin" 7 Jun 1942-20 Aug 2019 Born to Anna Belle Brown who raised her with Deloria's stepfather, Willie Cephas. Worked in the Food Service department of Southwest Texas University for 20 years.

Rhambo, Lula (Franklin) 20 Dec 1900-19 Aug 1935 Born to Robert Walter & Hattie Clifton (Rector) Franklin Sr. Married and divorced Marcus Rhambo. Died of septicemia.

Roberts, Ethel L. 30 Dec 1899-25 Oct 1966 Born to Willie S. & Alice (Gray) Roberts. Never married. Worked as a maid. Died of myocardial infarction.

Rollings, Annie Mae (Carr)

1913-1984 Married to Curtis Robert Rollings/Roland

Rollings, Curtis Robert 14 Jun 1917-10 Jun 1970 Born Farris, Texas, to Janie Rowland. Married to Annie May Carr. A yard worker in 1950. Private in 70 Aviation Squadron during World War II. General laborer. Died of cerebro-vascular hemorrhage.

Rucker, Josie 10 Oct 1850 - 3 Feb 1947 Born a slave to unknown parents. Single. A cook. Died in San Antonio of cardiac failure.

Sampson, Carrie (Berry) 27 Mar 1890-16 Sep 1976 Born to Henderson Berry. Married 1) 1910 Austin Bost. Died of cardiac arrest due to congestive heart failure and fractured left femur.

Sanders, Ernest Sr. 15 Aug 1896-28 May 1967 Born to Barnes & Della James (Gray) Sanders. Married to Sophronia Bios. Served in WWI as a private in Company 15 165 Depot Brigade WWI. Civil servant. Died of oat-cell carcinoma.

Sanders, Ozzie 17 Jan 1923- 6 May 1972 Born to Ernest & Sophronia (Bios) Sanders. Divorced. Retired Army sergeant, serving in WWII, Korea, and Vietnam. Death from carcinomatosis.

Sanders, Sophronia (Bios) 1901- 5 March 1984 Married to Ernest Sanders Sr.

Satterfield, Allie Mae (Fields) 3 Dec 1904-20 Sep 1975 Born to Allie & Josephine (Smiler) Fields. Married and divorced Floyd E. Satterfield. Cook at South West Texas University. Died of encephalomalacia.

Born a slave near the head of the San Marcos River to Jack & Maria (Hill) Gray. Her first owner, Joe Burleson, sold her to Pack Stevenson at Purgatory Springs where she remained until emancipation. Married John Smiler, a freighter, in 1871. Died of apoplexy due to influenza.

Smith, Addie B. Died 26 Feb 1917 May have died aged 2 months. Shares a stone with Jane Odems and three infants who died in 1912,1913, and 1914.

Smith Herbert 19 Apr 1895-20 Jul 1961 Born in Kyle to Tom & Lou (Kirby) Smith. He was a cook all his life, even in HQ Depot 317 Engineers during WWI. Died of cerebral thrombosis and lymphatic leukemia.

Smith, Iola

1894-25 Sep 1975

Born to Sam & Martha (Kyle) Brown. Married to Ivory Smith. Graduate of Huston-Tillotson College and received her masters degree from Prairie View A & M. Third-grade teacher in San Marcos for 45 years. Died of acute cerebral inschemia.

Smith, Ivory 14 Mar 1888-23 Dec 1976 Born to Carrie/Callie Lu Willie (father unknown). Married 1) Mamy Terrell in 1913 2) Iola Brown in 1921. Worked for a wholesale grocery as truck driver and later as coffee roaster and porter. Corporal US Army WWI. Died of cerebral vascular accident.

Taylor, Henry On stone with Mahalia Woods — no dates. But there is another roughly carved stone to H. Taylor, died 14 Sep 1936

Taylor, Norman circa 1906-22 Jan 1958 Born to Peter & Elisa (Embrey) Taylor. Single. A bricklayer when he died in Terrell, Kaufman County, Texas. Died of broncho-pneumonia.

Taylor, Nellie May (Cheatham) 23 Nov 1893- 8 Dec 1967 Born to Mose & Minerva (Traywick) Cheatham. Married to Taylor. Died of coronary occlusion.

Taylor, Ruth 7 Oct 1908-14 Sep 1936 Born to Ernest & Nettie (Norwood) Taylor. Single. Teacher at a night school. Died of a diabetic coma. On stone with her mother — see Nettie (Norwood) Taylor Williams.

Taylor, Sarah 18 May 1833- Jul 1908

Taylor, Sedrick 10 Aug 1971-16 Jan 2013 Born to Janice (Jackson) Taylor and was stepson of Willie A. Hicks Sr. Voted the most humorous in his eigth-grade class at San Marcos' Owen Goodnight Junior High in 1985.

Taylor, Willie Died 14 December 1961 Born San Marcos. At time of death, cafe owner in Oklahoma City.

Terrell, Mattie (Rasberry) 5 Mar 1876–2 Apr 1935 Born in Karnes County, Texas, to Mary (Harris) Rasberry. Married to Charles Terrell. Died of myocarditis.

Thomas, Clifton A. 31 Mar 1898-6 Sep 1899

Thomas, Leroy 24 Sep 1925-10 Dec 1994 Born to Leroy & Gertie (Jackson) Thomas

Thompson, Mary Jane (Moore) 10 Mar 1888-29 Oct 1950 Born to Columbus & Mary (Watkins) Moore. Married to Tommie Thompson Sr. Died of myocardial failure 12 days after an operation to remove a massive fibroid of the uterus. On stone with Tommie Thompson and Ellen Moore.

Thompson, Tommie Jr. 5 Oct 1904-24 May 1932 Born to Tommie & Mary (Moore) Thomas Sr. Single. Truck driver. Died of a gunshot wound through chest. Shot near the First African Baptist Church in San Marcos. Tolliver, Allie Mae (Brown) 22 Feb 1896-15 Nov 1992 Born to Joe & Clara (Nance) Brown. Married 1914 to John Mannie Tolliver. Educated in San Marcos and the I.M. Terrell High School, Fort Worth. Cook at a State College and cafeteria worker at the James Bowie Elementrary School

Tolliver, Jefferson Davis 15 Nov 1863 - 23 May 1937 Born a slave in Arkansas to Henry & Candis (Robinson) Tolliver. Married to Mary Elizabeth Richardson. Brick mason and AME minister.

Tolliver, John Manie 19 Sep 1893-21 Jan 1956 Born to Jefferson Davis & Mary Elizabeth (Richardson) Tolliver. Married 1914 to Allie Mae Brown. With Bud Hall, owned a barber's shop. Died of acute myocarditis.

Tolliver, Mary Elizabeth "Lizzie" (Richardson) 30 jJUn1868-3 Apri1940 Born to Lee & Caryline Richardson. Married toJefferson Davis Tolliver. Died of chronic myocarditis.

Tolliver, Melvin L. 23 Jul 1925-28 Jun 1961 Born to John Mannie & Allie Mae (Brown) Tolliver. Married to Walterene Shepard. Mail clerk. Served in WWII. Died of a heart attack

Traywick, Cebron 25 Mar 1881-12 Mar 1939 Born to Cebron Traywick. Married Louise Emma Brady. Had a barber's shop on The Beat in San Marcos. Cancer of esophagus.

Traywick, Cebron Leslie 19 Nov 1910- 30 Nov 1976 Born to Cebron & Louise Emma (Brady) Traywick. Married to Louise Connally in 1934. Truck driver for a wholesale grocery. US Navy WWII. Died of myocardial infarction.

Traywick, Elbrie Dec 1919-8June 1920 Born to Dale & Viola (Glover) Traywick. As no doctor present, no cause of death given.

Traywick, Fannie Belle (Bowens) 1910-12 Aug 1977 Born to Charlie & Julia (Jackson) Bowens. Married to Marion Lewis Traywick. Active in her church, superintendent of the Sunday school from 1958-1970, and a choir member.

Traywick, James 20 Dec 1914 - 9 Nov 1918 Born to Oscar & Josephine (Valdase) Traywick. Died of Spanish influenza.

Traywick, Lou Emma (Brady) Died 1915 ? Married to Cebron Leslie Traywick Sr.

Traywick, Louie

Circa 1885-17 Jul 1907

Traywick, Marion Lewis 30 Oct 1914-2 Oct 1984

Born to Cebron Leslie & Lou Emma (Brady) Traywick Sr. Married 1. Fannie Bowers 2. Genevieve Dukes, widow of Murphie Dukes who hd been murdered in 1933. A plumber known for his excellent workmanship in the many years he worked in the San Marcos area. By 1978, he was paralyzed with only the full use of his right arm, widowed and in a rest home.. In a piece in the Hays County Citizen of 04/27/1979, C.W. Wimberley reminisced with Marion, describing him as pleasant and cheerful. The two remembered the Katy Hole where both men swam as youngsters. They remembered it as the first truly integrated spot in San Marcos, possibly in Texas. *"Shaded by a dense growth of timber, it was the site where the poorer kids of San Marcos .. Whites, Blacks, Browns and all, went swimming together, nakid as a jaybird's butt, with utter disregard to ethnic balance, without racial conflict and concerned only with sharing the sheer joy of swimming in the clear cold waters of the San Marcos River."*

Wagner, Gloria Jeannette 25 Jun 1955-18 Aug 1996

Wagner, Jeannette (Kirk) 16 Aug 1937-27 Oct 2002 Born to Robert William & Annie Corean (Walker) Kirk. Annie was the daughter of Josh & Leola (Ratliff) Walker. Married 1953 to Archie Lee Wagner.

Walker, Joshua 7 Nov 1879-17 Jul 1953 Born to Staples, Texas, to James W & Nancy (Gray) Walker. Married circa 1902 to Leola Ratliff. Farmer on the Seguin Highway in 1950. Died of chronic myocarditis.

Wallace, Anderson Circa 1852 - 2 Sep 1926 Born a slave in Arkansas to William & Rose (Nichols) Wallace. Married 1. 1880 Letha Day 2. 1909 Mandy (Deary) Robinson. Farm laborer. Died of acute nephritis due to cold exposure.

Wallace, Letha (Day) Circa 1852-7 Jan 1905 Born a slave. Married 1880 to Anderson Wallace.

Wallace, Mandy

Born Fayette County, Texas, to Joe & Maria Deary. Second wife of Anderson Wallace. Died of chronic myocarditis.

Warren, Nora 1889-1984

Washington, Elbert 16 Jan 1883 -27 Dec 1974 (90) Born to Henry & Viola (Sheppard) Washington. A widower by 1920. Married to Mary Tolliver, born 17 May 1893. He had three great-great-great grandchildren. A farmer. Died of myocardial infarction.

Washington, Gordie (Miller) 20 Sep 1909-25 Jan 1993 Born to Isaac & Ellen (Roberts) Miller. Married to Monroe Thomas Washington.

Washington, Larry Charles 28 Feb 1958-30 Dec 1994 Born to Lloyd C. Kyle and Mary Louise Washington. His stepfather was Arthur Smith. Married to Jacqueline Yvett Williams. Living in Marble Falls when he died.

Washington, Monroe Thomas 1 Mar 1907-11 Sep 1974 Born to Frank P. & Sarah (Miller) Washington. Married to Gardie MIller. Worked as a custodian. Died of pneumonitis due to metastatic carcinoma of the colon.

Weathers, Barry Jerome 2 Jul 1957-11 Jul 2006 Born in New Orleans to Nathaniel & Inez Lucille (Callio) Weathers. Lived in Violet, St Bernard Parish, Louisina.

Weathers, Inez Lucille (Callio) 12 Sep 1934-29 March 2006 Born New Orleans to Lloyd & Elvira (Thornton) Callio. Married to Nathaniel Weathers who died in 1973 when the family was still in New Orleans.

Wells, Willie Sr. 2 Feb 1900-11 Oct 1961 Born Lockhart to unknown parents. Divorced. Died of uremia and pulmonary edema, due to malnutrition.

Wheeler, Viola Ann 1907-1984 Married to Willie A. Wheeler. A cook in 1940. In 1956, living at 756 West Gravel Street, San Marcos, with her daughter-in-law, Roberta, while her son, Pvt. Joe N. Wheeler, was assigned to 2nd Infantry "Indianhead" Division which was scheduled to move to Alaska as part of Operation Gyroscope.

Williams, Billy Joe Jr 8 Feb 1961- 5 October 1966 Born to Billy Joe & Robbie (Moore) Williams Sr. Father was driving the car in which his son died in a crash.

Williams, Bobbie Martin

28 Oct 1934-11 Nov 1994

Born to Lawrence George and Erna (Chapman) Williams. Corporal in US Marine Corps in Korea.

Williams, Charlotte Burnette 1936 - 24 April 2018 Born to Anna Belle (Cephas) Williams. In 1940, living with her mother, a younger sister anbd an aunt on Comal Street, San Marcos. Later resident of Maxwell, Caldwell County.

Williams, Clint Vernon 25 Mar 1931-30 Mar 2011 Born to Monroe & Maggie (Wilson) Williams. Married to Mary Ann Shaw.

Williams, David Sr. 16 June 1883-19 Aug 1960 Born to Richard Williams. Married Annabel Brown in 1935. Indicates he is a widower by 1940 and living with his widowed aunt, Patsy Smiley/Smiler on Steen Street in San Marcos. Laborer. Died of myocardial infarction and probable hepatic carcinoma.

Williams, Dorothy Lee (Kirk) 25 May 1934-17 Feb 1992 Born to Robert William & Annie Corean (Walker) Kirk

Williams, Elberta Peach (Powell) 3 Jun 1904- 1 August 1996 Born to Oscar & Ruby (Garrett) Powell. In 1940 living with her mother, Ruby, and her stepfather, Isaiah Charles "I.C'" Berry. Elberta was a cook.

Williams, Frank 1921-1967 Born to Monroe & Maggie (Wilson) Williams.

Williams, Geneva Irene (McNeil) 15 April 1924-8 Jul 1969 Born to George & Jeanne (Davis) McNeil. Married to Oscar Williams Jr.

Williams, Gertrude Irene (Young) 21 Jan 1901-26 Feb 1968 Born to Oscar & Elizabeth (Burnham) Young. Married to Oscar Williams Sr. Worked as a maid in a funeral parlor. Died of pneumonitis due to metastatic carcinoma of the breast.

Williams, Lottie Mae (Wright) 18 May 1904-25 Apr 1995 Born to Anderson & Hattie Bertha (Johnson) Wright. Married to Thomas L. Williams.

Williams, Mary (Brown) 26 Apr 1888-28 Jun 1968 Born to John H. & Emma (Ford) Brown.

Williams, Monroe Sr. 14 Jul 1883- 22 Oct 1938 Born Caldwell County to unknown parents. Married 1914 to Maggie Wilson. In 1918, working fro San Marcos Utility Company. In 1920 was a fireman. In 1930 a farm laborer, but at time of death a nightwatchman at San Marcos Oil Mill. Died of peritonitis. Williams, Monroe Jr. 30 Oct 1923-12 Jan 1974 Born to Monroe & Maggie (Wilson) Williams. Was a barber. Served as a corporal in the US Army in World War II. Living in San Antonio when he died of carcinoma of the lung.

Williams, Nettie Taylor (Norwood) 14 Feb 1889-21 Aug 1968 Born to Neil & Martha (Johns) Norwood. Married 1. Ernest Taylor 2) Carl Williams — divorced by 1930. Died of carcinomatosis. Working in a telephone office in San Marcos in 1930. On stone with her daughter, Ruth Taylor.

Williams, Oscar Sr.

5 Jun 1900-21 Nov 1960

Born to Bill & Lula (Burleson) Williams. Married 1921 Gertrude Young. Director of colored funerals for Pennington Funeral Homes, originally A.B. Rogers Funeral Home for which Oscar began working at the age of five, staying with them for more than 50 years. He was remembered as *"kind, courteous and helpful."* Died of adeno carcinoma of the stomach.

Williams, Oscar Jr.

3 Jan 1923-21 Oct 1992

Born to Oscar & Gertrude Irene (Young) Williams Sr.. Married to Geneva McNeil. Served in the US Army's 92nd Division as a radio operator in WWII. After the war, he got a civil service job with the Signal Corps at Fort Sam Houston, San Antonio, before transferring to Fort Worth, and finally to Sacramento, California, where he died.

Williams, Robbie Mae (Moore)

1942-5 Jan 1999

Born to Robert & Stella Mae (Badger) Moore. After Robbie's father's death, Stella married John Henry Hardeman. Robbie Mae married and divorced Billy Joe Williams.

Williams, Sarah (Houston)

1851-11 Mar 1921

Born a slave. Married 1875 to Ransom Williams who is believed to have been a slave of the Bunton family who came from Kentucky and started a plantation at Mountain City. Four years before their marriage, Ransom bought a 45-acre farm near Bear Creek in Travis County close to the Hays County line. Ransom died in 1901 but Sarah and several of their nine children continued to live on the farm until 1905. Sarah died of a dropsical condition. See the Ramsom and Sarah Williams farmstead project (instigated when the toll road, SH 45, led to archeological field investigations) at texasbeyondhistory.net Ransom Williams may also be buried in the San Marcos-Blanco Cemetery.

Williams, Thomas L. 21 Dec 1900- 11 Feb 1987 Married and divorced Lottie Mae Wright. Carpenter's helper in 1950.

Williams, Tishia (Durham) 4 Apr 1885-23 May 1963 Born to Tom & Laura (Green) Durham. Married 1. 1902 Milton Cheatham Sr. 2. Will B Williams who was 11 years younger than Tishia. Died of bronchial pneumonia due to malnutrition.

Willie, Callie R. (Patrick) Circa 1874-28 Aug 1940

Born to Will Patrick. Widowed by 1920. Ran a washing service in her home. Living in San Antonio when she died of cardiac insufficiency.

Wilson, Anternette "Nettie" (Kyle) 12 May 1925-8 Sep 1991 Born Seguin, Guadalupe County, to Lloyd Lee & Louise (Miller) Kyle. Married 1. 1943 Edward Mickle, 2. 1963 Peter Wilson. Living in Fort Worth when she died.

Wilson, Frank 1890-1967 Born to John & Lou Famie (Kyle) Wilson. In 1910, living with his sister, Florence and husband, Laurence Sheffield (a hotel cook), in San Marcos.

Wilson, Loney Annie (Mitchell) 19 Mar 1902- 3 March 1988 Born to Ben & Pinkey (Blue) Mitchell. Married to Thomas Jefferson Wilson. Died in Denver, Colorado.

Wilson, Peter Jr. 1916-1989 Second husband in 1963 of Anternette (Kyle Wilson)

Wilson, Pinkey Ciirca 1889-21 Apr 1917

Wilson, Thomas Jefferson 3 Feb 1903-23 Aug 1979 Born to John & Lou Famie (Kyle) Wilson. Married to Loney Annie Mitchell.

Wilson, Thomas Lee 28 Sep 1931-3 May 2006 Born to Thomas Jefferson & Loney (Mitchell) Wilson. Died in Denver, Colorado.

Winn, Mattie Lee (Luck) Aug 1884-10 Mar 1917 Born to Charles & Lottie (Martin) Luck. Married 1914 Leon C. Winn. Mattie was a school teacher. Died of rheumatism with intestinal tubercular conditions, also of left lung.

Winslow, Elizabeth Tammy (McHenry) 27 Aug 1923- 21 Sep 2008 Born to Joe & Addie Mae McHenry. Married Henry French Winslow Sr. Lived on Long Island, New York. Died in Austin.

Winslow, Henry French Jr. 7 Jan 1949-25 Mar 1989 Born to Henry French & Elizabeth Winslow Sr. in the Bronx, New York where his father taught at an institute Attended Academy of Aeronautics, Bichmond College CLINY Staten island

at an institute. Attended Academy of Aeronautics, Richmond College CUNY Staten island (BNS psychology, Columbia University School of Social Work New York, Masters in Social Work. Also studied in London. Volunteered at Creedmore State Hospital, working with autistic children, He was an author and essayist. School social worker with Board of Education until his death.

Woods, Mahalia On stone with Henry Taylor — no dates.

Born a slave. Plantation owner James Madison Hawkins (named for his father's classmate at college, later Pres. Madison) is said to have been the father of her daughter, Martha Benny, who married Ed Tom Lawshe. Came to Texas with Dr. Peter & Georgia (Lawshe) Woods.

Woody, Clarence W. 23 May 1881-23 Jul 1957 Born in Gainsville, Texas, to Louis & Elizabeth (Stone) Woody. Married Sophia ?. Died of carcinoma of the mouth.

Wrenn, Elizabeth (Terrell)

2 Dec 1903-20 Nov 1973

Born in Karnes City, Texas, to Charles & Mattie (Rasberry) Terrell. Married 1925 to Glynn Wrenn. In 1926, they were both appointed to teach at San Marcos Dunbar High School from which Elizabeth had graduated. Elizabeth also taught in Fredericksburg; Reedsville, Caldwell County; Corsicana and La Vernia before receiving a Bachelor's degree from Prairie View A & M in 1938. In 1942, Elizabeth began teaching at George Washington Carver, a school for Blacks, in the Edgewood Common District of San Antonio where she was the first Black teacher. During the summers from 1949 through 1951, she attained a Master's degree from the University of Nebraska. In 1959, when the Edgewood District's new Lincoln Elementary School opened, she was appointed the first principal. Retiring after 41 years in education, 24 spent in the Edgewood District of San Antonio, Elizabeth's kindness, helpfulness and her endeavors to improve the community were recognized when, on 18 March 1968, Edgewood's newest junior high school was named in her honor, the E. T. Wrenn Middle School. Elizabeth and Glynn divorced in 1954. When she died of gangrene of both feet due to diabetes mellitus. She was laid to rest in this cemetery where her mother is also buried. Wright, John William 11 Mar 1935-29 Mar 1986 Served as A3C in US Air Force in Korean Conflict.

Wright, Lewis James 9 May 1906- 20 July 1967 Born to Anderson & Hattie Bertha (Johnson) Wright. Married to Mattie Burleson. Died of asphyxiation due to aspiration. Laborer.

Wright, Mattie (Burleson) 1911- 22 Mar 1994 Born Martindale to Jerry & Julia Burleson. Married Lewis James Wright.

Wright, William Bird Jr. 16 Dec 1907-23 May 1966 Born to William & Mary Bird (Lawshe) Wright. Married Bird Lynn Myers. Retail wood dealer.. Died of probable cardiac arrhythmia from adrenalin reaction due to bronchial asthma.

Young, Ora Jean (Odoms) 16 Jul 1929-9 May 1993

Born to Porter & Josephine (Miles) Odoms. Stepfather was Leon Cheatham. Married to Scott Eugene Young. One of San Marcos' best bakers, learning as a child from watching her mother and aunt, Hattie Nell Mack, at work at San Marcos Academy. Before she took charge of The Bakery on Hopkins Street, she cooked at Hills' Restaurant Carson's, Ramada inn, Palmer's, HEB bakery, and Katy Station.
