Chapman William Thomas 9 Mar 1835 6 Mar 1917 Married to widowed Martha Ann (Box) Marshall in 1873 CSA Co A 12th GA Artillery & Infantry - prisoner of war at Point Lookout, Maryland Dripping Springs postmaster 1872-1889. Merchant and land developer. Responsible for the creation of the city of Dripping Springs. In partnership with A.L. Davis, Sr., on 13 Oct 1883, sold Wallace Mountain with the stipulation that "one acre (or a sufficiency) of land ... Wallace mountain for a Public burial ground for the Neighbourhood (sic)."

Crow Paul Mack 18 Feb 1894 14 Feb 1951 Son of McCreary & Stella H. (Roberts) Crow. Married to Vennie Shelby in Fort Worth. Served in WWI. Accountant to T & P Railway in Marshall when he died of mistral & aeortic stenosis. Myocardial infraction.

Crow Stella Henrietta (Roberts) 8 Mar 1873 29 May 1954 Married to McCreary Crow. Daughter of J.F. & Brazoria (Lincecum) Roberts who was the niece of famous Texas botanist, Gideon Lincecum who kept cattle in the Dripping Springs area during the Civil War. Died of cardiac decorporation, aortic regurgitation, valvular stenoma.

Crow Vennie (Shelby) 27 Aug 1895 19 Dec 1965 Married to Paul M. Crow

Davis Albert Lawson, Sr. 1824 8 Aug 1888 On stone/Nancy Jane (Runnels) Davis. Co B. Border's TX Cavalry CSA. Merchant and land developer in partnership with W.T.Chapman, donating land for Wallace Mountain Cemetery. His son A.L. Davis, Jr. (married Willie Herndon) branched out on own, moving to San Marcos because he didn't want his daughters marrying "these goat herders up there." ALD, Jr. founded the Southern Grocery Company of San Marcos, "a wholesale company so big it purchased baking powder by the freightcar load." ALD, Jr. became mayor of San Marcos where daughter, Carol, dated a young Lyndon Baines Johnson, much to her father' chagrin, doing his best to thwart the romance which fizzled out on its own.

Davis Bradley 25 Feb 1909 6 Jun 2013 Son of Isaac VanZandt and Katie May (Howard) Davis. Never married. Educated in Dripping Springs then received degree in pre-med with majors in Zoology and Biology from UT Austin . Taught at UT's Junior High, a College of Education lab, until it closed, then at Dripping Springs High School. Very active in Boy Scouts, being a counselor at New Mexico's Philmont Camp for many years. In 1974, curator of Friday Mountain Camp for boys and girls. Spent four summers working on white-water rafts in the Grand Canyon. Served in WWII with USAF as ground instructor until war ended, then in Italy working with education program for returning servicemen. A man of who was interested in everything, Bradley was a font of knowledge until he died at the age of 104.

Davis Elbert Hudson 1907 1995 On stone/ Erlene (McLendon) Davis. Son of I.V. & Katie (Howard) Davis. Was principal of Dripping Springs School in 1930s. Died in Harris County, Texas.

Davis Erlene (McLendon) 26 Jul 1907 16 Jul 1949 On stone/Elbert Hudson Davis. Daughter of William Sampson & Effie (Herndon) McLendon. Died in San Antonio of small brain tumor, left cerebral hemisphere primarily and small cord tumor probably secondary

Davis Isaac VanZandt Jr. 23 Mar 1867 19 Feb 1911 On stone/Katie Howard m.c. 1892. Died of a stroke. Ranched in Sunset Canyon West area until Texas tick fever destroyed herd so he sold half his land. Moved to Dripping Springs when his children were of school age..

Davis Katie May (Howard) 21 Mar 1871 28 Apr 1961 On stone/Isaac VanZandt Davis m. c. 1892. Daughter of Morgan Homer & Mary Elizabeth (Greene) Howard who in 1881 bought the Lorenzo Moore (Indian attack victim) ranch on McGregor Road. Died of hemorrhage from the colon, adenocarcinoma of the colon.

Davis Nancy Jane (Runnels) 17 July 1842 6 April 1927 Daughter of Bury & Mary (Parker) Runnels. Married to A.L. Davis, Sr. Died of general senility.

Edwards Hattie (Hobby) 21 Jan 1843 16 Jan 1895 Married to William J. Edwards

Edwards William J. 18 Sep 1803 31 Dec 1887 Married to Hattie (Hobby) Edwards. Born in Englad. A gardener in Austin in 1880.

Egerton Infant 3 Oct 1901 Infant of T.H & Willie Pearl (Chapman) Egerton

Egerton T. H. Jr "Little" 31 May 1905 2 Jun 1907 Son of T.H & W.P. Egerton. The Egerton children were grandchildren of W.T. & M.A. (Box) Chapman and were buried in the Marshall-Chapman graveyard in downtown Dripping Springs and later moved to this cemetery.

Ellis Mary (Thurman) 10 Dec 1873 24 Jan 1917 Daughter of Henry Garrett & Margaret Caroline (Maxey) Thurman, Jr. Married Howard Ellis (1874-1931) in 1892. Originally buried in the Thurman Bend Cemetery, but moved to Wallace Mountain when the Mansfield Dam was built in 1937. Howard Ellis, Mary's husband, took as his second wife, Hattie Herrin (1899-1933)., whose father, James Monroe Herrin, served as a Texas Ranger in Co. F Minutemen of Gillespie County in 1874. When

Hattie's mother, Rebecca Jane McDonald, was one-year- old, she was captured (along with her mother, sister and three cousins) by Kiowa Indians on 8 August 1865 during the McDonald Massacre near Harper, Gillespie County, that claimed the life of her father. In December, a treaty was made and the Kiowas brought their captives to the Indian Agency at Council Grove, Kansas. However it was almost a year before the MacDonalds were returned home. Howard and Hattie Ellis are buried in Wharton City Cemetery, Texas.

Gibson Bluford McDonald 1838 Jan 1888 On stone/ Martha (Dollahite) Gibson. Born in Jefferson City, Missouri, to ? & Nancy Gibson. In 1850, Bluford and his widowed mother were in Tarrant County, Texas, but in Hays County by 1960. Pvt Co C 16 TX Inf CSA

Gibson Martha (née Dollahite) 7 March 1843 2 May 1933 On stone/Bluford Gibson. Daughter of James & Gillie (Haliburton) Dollahite. Died of uremia and chronic nephritis. The Dollahites were plagued by tragedy. Martha's brother, Charles Wesley Dollahite, a teacher, was returning from school with his son at Round Mountain, north of Johnson City, in July 1869, when they were scalped by Indians. Martha's sister, Isabella Dollahite, married Benjamin Taylor, but died when her children were young. Sister, Mary Dollahite, became Benjamin's second wife. Mary, Benjamin, and three Taylor children perished in 1882 when their house was washed away in an Onion Creek flood. Martha herself lost a son in a tragic accident in 1889.

Gillis Hoyle Cecil 26 Mar 1909 30 Apr 1986 On stone with Melba Aileen (Kilgo) Gillis. Son of William Alexander & Sarah Elizabeth (Burkhalter) Gillis. Married to Melba Aileen kilgo.

Gillis Melba Aileen (Kilgo) 30 Aug 1917 1 Dec 2014 On stone, married to Hoyle Cecil Gillis

Gilpin Clarence Ray 31 Aug 1887 24 Oct 1887 Infant son of John Tyree & Louissa A. (Womack) Gilpin Gilpin 28 Sep 1882 Infant daughter of Samuel D. & Ella J. (Womack) Gilpin.

Gilpin Louissa "Lou" A. (Womack) 13 Feb 1865 1 Oct 1888 Wife of John Tyree Gilpin who later married Ida Young. John and Samuel (above) were brothers who married sisters, Lou and Ella Womack. They were druggists in Dripping and Buda.

Goodson James Henry (Dr.) 9 Jan 1925 5 Dec 1993 On stone/married 27 Dec 1947 Wanda Minnette Pelphrey. Born to Henry Louis & Vera Elizabeth (Warren) Goodson. Dr. Goodson may have been a gynecologist. The Goodsons lost a day-old premature baby in Dallas in 1955. There is a plaque embedded in the grave showing Dr. Goodson was a member of the Sons of the American Revolution.

Goodson Wanda Minnette (neé Pelphrey) 6 Nov 1926 20 May 2015 Daughter of Lasco Wheeler & Nauty Byrd (Worrell) Pelphrey. Married to Dr. James Henry Goodson. Member of the Daughters of the American Revolution.

Greathouse Clyde Duncan Sr. 31 Aug 1892 2 Dec 1986 Son of James Willard & Mary (Pursley) Greathhouse. Married first 1930 Mayme Clara Cadell (1901-1952). Married second to Othella Brooks.

Greathouse Othella (née Brooks) 10 Aug 1895 17 Mar 1966 Daughter of Old Texas & Maggie (Rhodes) Brooks. Married first to Delmon Ross Furr (1889-1947) and second to Clyde D. Greathouse,. Died of urinary tract infection.

Hall, Bette Jo 29 Aug 1939 8 Nov 2021 Daughter of Samuel M & Agnes (Gunn) Hall. Worked for the University of Texas. Member of the Daughters of the Republic of Texas and of the Red Hat Society. Had three children, two with the last name, Newell.

Hall Verna Mae (Goleman) 1920 18 Jan 2015 On stone with James Ross Hall, married 14 June 1940. Born to Thomas Abner & Isabel (Storey) Goleman. Was a legal secretary for the Board of Control in the State Capitol. Moved with husband James R. Hall in 1951 to their Dripping Springs ranch.

Hammack Marguerite Ruperta (Cavett) 21 Jan 1895 26 Aug 1983 Daughter of Mose C. & Georgia (Pound) Cavett and granddaughter of Dr. Joseph Pound. Taught in New Mexico where she met her husband, Charles Ross Hammack, son of James William & Lela Ophelia (Thomas) Hammack. They married on 19 June 1920 in the Dripping Springs Baptist Church because she

thought it was prettier than the Methodist one. A widow by 1934, she returned to live with her mother in the Pound House, built by her grandfather, Dr. Joseph Pound. Member of Order of the Eastern Star and founding member of Camp Ben McCulloch UDC. Donated five acres to United Methodist Church, and three acres plus the Pound Homestead to the City of Dripping Springs for a museum.

Henslee Cora Auguste (Ottmers) 7 Nov 1899 23 Sep 1970 Daughter of Edward & Mary Bethel Moore (Stribling) Ottmers. On stone/ Uncas Norville Hensleer Sr. Worked for Civil Service at Randolph Air Force Base, San Antonio.

Henslee Frances E. (Carson) 6 Jan 1930 20 Dec 2014 Daughter of Herbert H. & Velma Hansel (Moore) Carson. Grew up in Austin. Married Uncas Norville Henslee Jr, in 1953, then moved to Huntsville where she was a bookkeeper before starting her own accounting firm, ABET Machines. Frances and Norville kept the business going after the death of their son, Thomas, until they retired in 2010. In 2011, Frances suffered a stroke in 2011 from which she never fully recovered. She was cremated and her ashes were brought to Wallace Mountain.

Henslee James Edward 28 Dec 1927 26 Apr 2006 Son of Uncas Norville Sr. & Cora Auguste (Ottmers) Henslee. On stone/ Lillian Carson married 15 May 1953. Served in the US Army in Korea in 1950, receiving three Bronze Stars and a Presidential Unit Citation. Member of Masonic Lodge of Florence and of the Bricklayers, Masons and Plasterers' International Union of America. He helped with 4-H projects and raised and trained border collies. Her sister, Lilian, born 6 Sep 1932, married Uncas Jr's older brother, James Edward Henslee, on 15 May 1953.

Henslee Margaret Louise (Dunning) 9 Jul 1935 27 Jan 2014. On stone and married 16 June 1961to Thomas Lyle Henslee. Born Evansville, Indiana, to Herbert & Kathleen Dunning.

Henslee Thomas E. 21 Jul 1954 25 Oct 1998 Son of Uncas Norville Jr. & Frances (Carson) Henslee.

Henslee, Thomas Lyle 30 Dec 1934 28 Aug 2016 Son of Uncas Norville Sr. & Cora Auguste (Ottmers) Henslee. Married Margaret Louise "Peggy" Dunning.

Henslee Uncas Norville Jr . 26 Mar 1926 2 Feb 2011 Son of Uncas Norville & Cora Auguste (Ottmers) Henslee. Born in Johnson City, Texas. Married Frances Carson in 1953 and moved to Huntsville. Salesman for Lance, Inc. then joined his wife in family business ABET Machines. On board USS Nevada in the Pacific WWII. Ashes to be brought to Wallace Mountain.

Henslee Uncas Norville, Sr. 6 Apr 1893 13 Apr 1967 Son of James D. & Katherine (Holman) Henslee. On stone/Cora (Ottmers) Henslee married 4 Jul 1920. Died of massive cerebral and cerebellar hemorrhage resulting from rattlesnake bite to left hand. Uncas' niece, Anna Pelllar married Robert Benjamin Felps, great grandson of Dr. James Odiorne of Johnson City.

Hinds Benjamin Jefferson II 27 Apr 1818 28 Nov 1884 Son of Benjamin Jefferson and Mary (Childress) Hinds. A Mayflower descendent. Married in 1849 Mary Jane Clifton. B. J. was in Williamson County in 1850 where he was a farmer, living next door to brother-in-law Samuel Farris whose sons were also no respecters of the law. By 1880, he was in Hays County, in the Driftwood area, listed as "trading," and living close to his father-in-law, Dr. Harrison who later moved to Dripping Springs. A notorious outlaw (weapon of choice, a knife) and gambler, playing poker with the likes of John Wesley Hardin. Spent time in the Llano jail, although his usual territory was the greater Austin area, but had family in the Lone Mountain area. Did five years for horse stealing, although he is known to have killed several men. Served in Mexican and Civil Wars - CSA Co A Morgan's Regiment Texas Cavalry.

Hobdy William 18 Sep 1803 31 Dec 1887 Born in North Carolina, moved to Alabama, then Louisiana, and Texas. Stock raising in Goliad County in 1860 with his wife, Susanna, and niece Amanda who married R.O. Coaksey. Came to Dripping Springs for a healthier climate. In 1877, bought 160 acres of B. F. Hanna league from H. C. Durar, but was boarding with Beverley Spaw in 1880, listed as farming and having lung disease. Died on farm of his niece and husband, W. T. Edwards.

Howard Dannie (née Crow) 1869 1913 Married to James Herkimer Howard.

Howard James Herkimer 6 June 1867 May 15 1950 Married to Dannie (Crow) Howard. Son of Morgan Homer & Mary (Greene) Howard, both from New ork. Died of generalized arteriosclerosis, hypertension, bronchopneumonia. Brother of Katie May (Howard) Davis.

Howard Mary Elizabeth (Greene) 27 Aug 1829 1915 Married 29 Dec 1851 to Morgan Homer Howard. Daughter of James and Catharina (Dominick) Greene.

Huffman Eula D. (née Brooks) 10 Feb 1912 12 Mar 1985 Daughter of Samuel Houston & Elizabeth (Garner) Brooks. On stone/James Park Huffman, married 20 Mar 1935.

Huffman James Park 13 Jul 1910 5 Jun 1994 Son of Milton Jackson & Emma Missouri (Park) Huffman. On stone/ Eula (Brooks) Huffman. Pvt US Army Air Corps WWII

Hunt George A 8 Nov 1854 26 Dec 1941 Married 1) Anna? He as a carpenter but later a cotton gin operator. Married 2) the widowed Mary Elizabeth (Pound) Walters. For 10 years, he was cotton-gin inspector for the Texas Prison System. He also did a great deal of traveling as a state cotton gin inspector for the Texas Department of Agriculture. Living in Kyle when Mary Elizabeth died. By 1940 living with his son, De Witt Hunt and his wife in Stillwater, Oklahoma. Although George is remembered in the Wallace Mountain cemetery, he has a grave marker in the Fairlawn Cemetery, Stillwater, and was probably buried there.

Hunt Mary Elizabeth (Pound) 20 Mar 1856 1 Oct 1933 Daughter of Dr. Joseph & Sarah (Ward) Pound. Known as "Bettie" and "Aunt Pats." Married 1) 17 Dec 1885 widower, Civil War veteran, Samuel T. Walters (1838-1890) and lived in Blanco County. Bettie and daughter Mattie Lou "Birdie" came to live with her parents until she remarried. 2) 1 Sep 1901 widower George Arthur Hunt, his second wife. Died of cirrhosis of the liver. Mary Elizabeth's death year was 1933, not 1935.

Jenkins Della Mae (Watson) 23 Jun 1917 6 Nov 1996 Daughter of A.B. "Bud" & Pearl (Robbins) Watson. Born in the Marshall-Chapman House. On stone/Raymond Jenkins m. 10 Jan 1937. Two of Della's Robbins aunts, Maggie and Sallie were married to two of Benjamin Stephenson's sons, Frank and Joseph.

Jenkins Raymond 4 Feb 1911 7 Jan 2000 Descendent of Thomas Breedlove, Cherry Springs, brother-in-law of Benjamin F. Stephenson, Dr. Pound's son-in-law. On stone/Della Mae (Watson) Jenkins m. 10 Jan 1937

Johnson Catherine (née Hyde) 17 Mar 1810 12 Feb 1883 Married to Thomas Johnson on 7 May 1837. Originally buried in Johnson Institute Cemetery where Raddha Madhav now stands on FM1826.

Johnson Thomas Jefferson 8 Oct 1805 2 Sep 1868 Married to Catherine (Hyde) Johnson. Known as "Old Bristletop," his unique hairstyle can be seen in a photograph hanging in Bandera's Frontier Museum. A reformed alcoholic, he moved to Friday Mountain, Hays County, where he ran a co-educational secondary boarding school, Johnson Institute. He died of cholera after a recruiting trip to Galveston. One daughter, Lizzie, became renowned as a cattle queen who with, husband, retired preacher Hez Williams attempted to establish Hays City as the Hays County seat. The two Johnson graves were moved to Wallace Mountain circa 2007 some years after the International Society of Divine Love (aka Barsana Dham now Radha Madhav Dham) bought the site of the former Johnson Institute for their Hindu temple. The reason being that all Christian association had been removed from the top and bottom of the stones, prompting the rescinding of the historical marker.

Jordan Franklin W. 4 Mar 1864 28 Mar 1883 Son of W. M & Mary J (Fiquet) Jordan. On stone with mother, Mary Jordan. Killed as the result of a prank during a mock gun battle at his father's school, Dripping Springs Academy.

Jordan Mary J. (Fiquet) 1838 24 Jun 1891 Wife of Professor W. M. Jordan, nephew of Jesse McLendon.

Killough Arthur Sheridan 9 Mar 1894 16 Mar 1964 Married to Laura Mae (Brooks). Son of Charles Cavendish & Johanna (Wetterling) Killough. Contractor. Pvt Battalion E 131st Field Artillery in WWI. Died of myocardial infraction - encephalomacia due to cerebral arteriosclerosis with right hemiplegia.

Killough Laura Mae (née Brooks) 7 Oct 1900 26 May 1988 Daughter of Old Texas & Margaret Elizabeth (Rhodes) Brooks. Married to Arthur S. Killough.

Kirchner Harry E. Jr. 1937 February 1993 Son of Harry E. & Alice Kirchner. Former All-America center, member of Texas Christian University's 60-year All-Time basketball team. 1957-1959 letterman for the Horned Frogs and named to three All-America teams in 1959.

Kirk Franklin McCree 23 Sep 1852 26 Oct 1901 Son of Marvel & Anna (Harris) Kirk. Married 12 Dec 1877 to Mary Ellendor Cavett (daughter of Richard Savannah & Virginia (Martin) Cavett).

Kirk Marvel 10 Feb 1819 3 Mar 1892 Father was Parham Kirk. Married Anna Harris (b. 4 Sep 1823 d. 9 Sep 1880 in Wheelock). Owned plantation in Jasper Co. Mississippi before Civil War

Lanterman Abraham Charles 22 Dec 1812 14 May 1896 Son of John & Elizabeth (McKinnie) Lanterman. Married 16 Apr 1840 to Catherine M. Cabaniss. Farming in Blanco county in 1880.

Lanterman Catherine Minerva (Cabaniss) 22 May 1819 16 Jan 1900 Daughter of Charles F. & Mary P (Waggener) Cabaniss. Married to Abraham Lanterman.

Lee Gennie Mae (Bell) Robbins 21 Jan 1915 16 Jan 1900 Daughter of James Richard & Fanny (Spell) Bell, Charleston, SC. Married 1) James R. Robbins 2) James L. Lee. Moved to Texas to be near her family.

Leinneweber Mary Frances (Findley) 1859 27 Jul 1899 Daughter of John & Martha M. (Fussell) Findley. Second wife (m. 1896) of Pedernales Leinneweber, a blacksmith, son of George Columbus & Elizabeth (Colbath) Leinneweber Sr. Pedernales' first wife (m. 1878) was Lydia Jane Pursley (8 Sep 1862 - 27 Nov 1892), daughter of William Darrel & Bathsheba (Whitley) Pursley.

Lewis Lleta Edessa (Stephenson) 10 Apr 1890 30 Jun1971 Daughter of Benjamin & Indiana (Pound) Stephenson. Granddaughter of Dr. Joseph Pound. Married to Daniel Edgar Lewis (salesman in his mother's San Marcos bookstore). Died of pneumonia resulting from burns over her upper body when her clothing caught fire.

Livingston James E. 2 Aug 1831 1 Jul 1890 Born in South Carolina. Wife Louissa born in North Carolina circa 1841. Came to Texas from Tennessee. Were neighbors of Beverley Spaw. Fought for the Confederacy.

Long Wilma Ruth (Owens) 1 Nov 1961 7 Jan 2000 Daughter of Clifton Cameron and Marjorie Virginia (Hammack) Owens, great-great granddaughter of Dr. Joseph Pound. Married Christopher Eric Long (b. 5 Oct 1963) on 16 Jun 1984. Killed in a car crash with her father. On stone are three spaces, one for Wilma Ruth, one blank, for one of her sons, Zebulon Long, born 6 Feb 1987. In 2013, Zebulon is still alive and has recently created a Wallace Mountain cemetery association. Photographs of Wilma and Zebulon are embedded in the stone.

Marshall Burrell Jackson 9 Sep 1826 28 Feb 1872 First husband of Martha Ann Box (m. 6 Nov 1851 in Coosa County, Alabama) who in 1873 married W.T. Chapman. Bought 1111 acres of former Moss Ranch. Fifth official postmaster in Dripping Springs. Confederate veteran. Buried in sight of his home in Marshall-Chapman Cemetery. Reinterred in 1936 on Wallace Mountain when the Haydons bought the property.

Marshall Jefferson Davis 20 May 1861 Feb 1884 Son of Burrell Jackson Marshall & Martha Ann (Box) Marshall Chapman. A cowboy.

Marshall Mattie 12 Oct 1858 29 Jun 1890 Wife of Jefferson Davis Marshall

Martin, Mary Jane (Cockrill) Robbins — see Mary Jane (Cockrill) Robbins.

Moran Louis Joseph 19 Dec 1896 16 Sep 1965 Son of Oliver & Loda (Decote) Moreau. Legally changed name "Moreau" to "Moran" in 1916. Married to Nellie? Furniture retailer. Died of myocardial infraction/ arteriosclerotic coronary thrombosis.

McLendon Effie (Herndon) 1 April 1871 27 Jul 1937 Daughter of William & Mary V. (Powell) Herndon. On stone/ William Sampson "Samp" McClendon. Suicide by gunshot wound.

McLendon William Sampson "Samp" 6 Dec 1876 14 Oct 1940 Son of Isaac P.C. & Sallie (Sampson) McLendon. On stone / Effie (Herndon) McLendon. Owned the Dripping Springs Telephone Exchange and was postmaster for two years. Died of apoplexy due to high blood pressure.

Oldham Lovonia "Love" (Pound) 6 Aug 1870 19 Jul 1944 Daughter of Dr. J. M. & S. D. (Ward) Pound. On stone/ Overton H. Oldham, married 1902. Had at least four children, only one survived. Before her marriage, Love was selected several time as a maid of honor at the Mountain Remnant Confederate Reunions. She taught at Driftwood School. Died of senility.

Oldham Mary Vaughn 19 Apr 1911 Apr 1911 Infant daughter of Overton H & Lovonia (Pound) Oldham.

Oldham Overton Harris "Ove" 6 Jan 1864 27 June 1948 On stone/Lovonia (Pound) Oldham. Son of Overton H & Nancy (Woodward) Overton. Grew up on ranch near the Hays/Travis county line. Rancher. After his marraige, Ove had a store at Henly and served as postmaster there. He later ranched near San Marcos and also Driftwood before settling at Buda. Died of senility, arteriosclerosis.

Owens Clifton Cameron 27 Aug 1927 7 Jan 2000 Son of John Clifton & Evalena (Garrison) Owens. Cpl US Army WWII. Husband of Marjorie (Hammack) Owens (great-granddaughter of Dr. J.M. Pound). Killed in car crash with his daughter, Wilma Ruth (Owens) Long.

Owens, Marjorie Virginia (Hammack) 11 Aug 1921 10 Jan 2018 Born Van Horn, Texas, to Charles Ross & Marguerite Ruperta (Cavett) Hammack. Married Clifton C. Owens. Moved back to Dripping Springs when her father died in 1934. Grew up at the Pound House, built by her great-grandfather, Dr. Joseph M. Pound. Attended Nixon-Clay Business School then worked for Metcalf Engineering and the Texas Education Agency. After the Pound House became a museum, Marjorie served as a docent there.

Owens Samuel Roy 31 Jul 1893 23 Mar 1945 Son of George Lott. & Laura Virginia (Robbins) Owens. Maintenance contractor. Died of coronary occlusion. Married Verna Williams. on 2 Feb 1913

Pound Charles Ward "Bud" 4 Sep 1866 3 May 1911 Son of Dr. Joseph M. & Sarah D. (Ward) Pound. Stockman who had a ranch in the Carter Valley near Rock Springs, Texas. Died of typhoid fever in San Antonio. Never married.

Pound Jonathan Kester Aug 1872 18 Oct 1872 Infant son of Dr. Joseph M. & Sarah D. (Ward) Pound. Originally buried near the Pound House but later moved to Wallace Mountain.

Pound Joseph McKeaig 26 Oct 1826 20 Oct 1914 Son of Jonathan & Mary (Risley) Pound. Born in Kentucky and grew up in Illinois. On stone/ Sarah Dunbibben (Ward) Pound, married 13 November 1853 in Hinds County, Mississippi. Veteran of Mexican War (Pvt Quincy Riflemen, Co A. Fist Illinois Volunteers) and Civil War (Pvt. Co. F. 18th Darnell's Texas Cavalry then Assistant Surgeon at Camp Davis, near Kerrville, with Frontier Battalion). Pioneer and first doctor in Dripping Springs Area. Very active in CSA Veterans Affairs, founding member of Camp Ben McCulloch Chapter of UCV, and a Mason.

Pound Louisiana 4 Dec 1863 30 Mar 1885 Daughter of Dr. J.M. & S. D. (Ward) Pound.

Pound Olive Allen 7 Feb 1858 1861 Daughter of Dr. J. M. & S.D. (Ward) Pound. Originally buried near the Pound House but later moved to Wallace Mountain.

Pound Sarah Dunbibben (Ward) Pound 27 Jan 1832 2 May 1915 On stone/Dr. J. M. Pound, married 13 December 1853. Daughter of Charles W.T. & Mississippi (Terrell) Ward. Grew up in Hinds County, Mississippi. Sister of Indiana (Ward) Moss who named Dripping Springs after the spring on the Moss Ranch when her husband became the first postmaster.

Prochnow Frieda Clara (Schroeder) 26 Feb 1899 15 May 1981 Daughter of Ferdinand & Wilhelmina Caroline (Manka) Schroeder. Married c. 1919 to Paul Henry Prochnow. They lived near Johnson City and at Mt. Sharp. Husband Paul Prochnow (1893-1980) buried in Blanco.

Prochnow Henry Guy 9 May 1920 25 June 1993 TEC 4 US Army WWII Son of P.aul Henry. & Frieda Clara (Schroeder) Prochnow

Rambin Vaniece (Spinks) Swift 2 Dec 1936 4 Sep 2015 On stone with her first husband, Sterling Swift. Daughter of Van Wesley & Relda Spinks. Married Sterling "Bubba" Swift in 1959. She was a traveling home health nurse for the Texas Dept. of Health, an Austin ISD nurse, and realtor. Married James P. Rambin in 2011.

Married 2) about six years after William's death, widower farmer, William Martin. They were living together with one of his sons and several of her children in Hays County Precinct 4 in 1900. By 1910 William and Mary J. Martin (with her mother and some Robbins children) were both living in Precinct 6 Hays County, but in separate places, both occupied in farming. Mary records this as her second marriage (of 10 years duration) and William Martin, living by himself, just lists married. Mary lies buried with her first husband, William Hudson Robbins, at Wallace Mountain, and William with his first wife, Rutha, in the tiny Martin family Cemetery near Henly.

Robbins Robert R. Sr. 29 Jun 1941 16 Jul 1998 Son of James R. Robbins & Gennie Mae (Bell) Robbins Lee. U.S. Navy

Robbins Wallace Walker 16 Sep 1892 8 Apr 1957 Son of William Hudson & Mary Jane (Cockrill) Robbins. Pvt 36th Co 165 Depot Brigade WWI. Laborer. Died of carcinoma of the lungs.

Robbins, Webster H. "Webb" Feb 1882 4 Oct 1930 Son of William H & Mary Jane (Cockrill) Robbins. Never married. In 1900, living with his mother and stepfather, William Martin, and farming. In 1918, was a teamster in Dallas when he filled out his WWI registration form. A laborer when he died in an automobile accident at Boerne, Kendall County.

Robbins William Hudson "Hue" 23 Jun 1845 2 Apr 1894 Born to John & Sarah Robbins in Franklin County, Tennessee. First husband of Mary Jane (Cockrell) Robbins — married 5 Feb 1868. Had 19 children, including Della Cockrell, Lou Glosson, and Daisy King.

Rowland Fannie 1844 2 Jun 1907 Born in Georgia, married as a young teenager to Mr. Baird/Beard. Lost a daughter who fell on a "spinner" made from a spool that penetrated her eye. Living in Atlanta during the Civil War. Son, William Baird, is buried in Phillips Cemetery. Second husband died before 1900 when she and William were living with James O. Rowland (possibly her brother-in-law) and family.

Rowland James Oliver 15 Aug 1842 27 Mar 1928 Born Georgia — in 1900, he gives birthdate as August 1859 but in 1910, it is circa 1844 which is closer to his Civil War record which indicates he was born 1842/43. On stone/ Married to Mattie Elizabeth (Saxon) Rowland. Son of John Rowland. Died of senility and chronic nephritis. UCV on stone - pvt 16 Regt, Tx Cavalry

Rowland Mattie Elizabeth (née Saxon) 3 Feb 1860 27 Jul 1926 Daughter of John and Elizabeth Saxon. On stone/ James O. Rowland, married circa 1874. Died of angina pectoris and chronic carditis.

Rowland W. W. Grave later replaced and initials are now W M

Rowland William "Mitch" 8 Mar 1875 12 Oct 1931 Son of James O & Mattie E. (Saxon) Rowland. Engineer with SP Lines. Died of angina pectoris. Married 1897 Mary Isabel "Izzie" Glosson (1874-1938) daughter of James Walter & Susan (Humphreys) Glosson, later divorced. She is buried in San Antonio.

Sanders J. E. 2 Jan 1859 21 Aug 1899

Seal Charles C. 8 Oct 1862 3 Dec 1937 Son of George & Jane (Powell) Seal. Brought up by step father, Jesse McLendon. Married first (24 Mar 1881) Mattie Wallace, daughter of J.L. & M. (Gillespie) Wallace who is buried in the nearby Wallace Family Cemetery. After Mattie's death, Charles married Dilla Graham (22 Mar 1891). Deputy Sheriff, farmer, meatmarket butcher and postmaster. Died of mitral regurgitation of the heart.

Seal Dilla Mae (Graham) 25 Jan 1870 24 Dec 1944 Daughter of Cyrus S. & Martha (Keeney) Graham. Second wife of Charles Seal. Died of senile degeneration.

Seal Oscar Garland 31 Jul 1893 4 Jun 1962 Son of Charles & Dilla Mae (Graham) Seal. Cook 141 Inf 36th Div WWI Died of bilateral bronchopneumonia after a cerebral vascular accident.

Shelton Robert Francis 3 Aug 1917 12 Apr 1990 On stone/ Ima Lois (Breed) Shelton. Son of John Elbert & Lillian (Applewhite) Shelton and grandson of legendary doctor, Edgar Poe Shelton. Educator. Sgt US Army WWII. 26 years with DISD being its first high school and later its first elementary principal, also serving as superintendent. Robert Shelton Blvd named in his honor.

Simpson Mittie Ruth (Hammack) 14 Nov 1925 23 May 1998 Daughter of Charles Ross & Marguerite (Cavett) Hammack. Great-granddaughter of Dr. Joseph and Sarah Pound. Married William Edward Simpson. Member of the Eastern Star.

Slaughter Nellie Rae/Rea (Spaw) 15 Nov 1905 1997 Daughter of J.T. & E.M (Blue) Spaw. Married 1) 1928 James E. Pearson - separated then killed in car accident 2) Roy Owens died after 10 years 3) Lewis Moran died after 16 years 4) Ed Slaughter

Smith Verna Ruth (Griffin) 1 Sep 1937 7 Nov 2008 Married to Roger Smith. Grandmother of David Matthew Gillis. Daughter Tammie married Poe Shelton, son of R.F. & L (Applewhite) Shelton.

Sorrell Mittie Ruth (Pound) 2 Dec 1863 1 Jan 1954 Daughter of Dr. Joseph M. & Sarah (Ward) Pound. Milliner, dressmaker, and later farmer. Married first in 1904 widower Jacob Peter "Jake" Sorrel and moved to Oklahoma (Jacob died 20 March 1916 when a tree fell on him). In early 1917, the widowed Mittie took her nieces, Marguerite Cavett and Birdie Walters, from Oklahoma to Silver City, New Mexico, so Marguerite could continue her studies at the Normal School and Birdie could receive treatment for tuberculosis. After a few weeks living in a tent, Birdie died. Mittie remained to look after Marguerite until she graduated, then returned to the Pound Farmstead which, single-handedly, she ran until she married Jacob's widowed brother, Oliver Swain Sorrell (died 16 Jan 1949), circa 1938 and returned to Oklahoma. Her husbands were the sons of A.H. & Amanda Melvina Sorrell. Mittie spent her last days at the Pound Farmstead of she owned one-quarter share. Died of cardiac decorporation and senility. No children.

Spaw Beverley Lemon 7 Aug 1837 30 Jan 1922 Married to Sisrelda Emmerline (née Dye) Spaw. Served in the Union Army as a Cpl in 12 Reg Kentucky Cavalry (Union) - said to be called Blue because of this. Bought 160 acres from H. C. Durar in 1877.

Spaw Chester Lamar 19 Sep 1916 4 Nov 2012 Son of George Beverley & Willie Mae (Peal) Spaw. Married 29 March 1941 Maurine Elliot. Seabee in US Navy in Pacific in WWII with 14th Naval Construction Battalion. Worked for US Post Office for 30 years then started an air-conditioning business. At age 74 began Kilkenny Cakes. His grandson, Greg, died in a car accident the day after Chester's death while on his way to help organize his funeral.

Spaw Davis Shelton 5 Feb 1900 12 Jan 1903 Child of Robert E. & Ida M. (Robbins) Spaw.

Spaw Ella Magnolia (Blue) 25 May 1872 10 Jul 1965 Daughter of Emmanuel & Sylastina (Cannon) Blue. Married to John Theoplas Spaw. Died of coronary occlusion.

Spaw Ethel May (Huffstetler) 17 May 1901 26 Mar 1971 Daughter of Wm & Ethel (Gollsby) Huffstetler. Married 1)Nathaniel Adrian Clark 2) George Beverley Spaw Sr. in 1933. Died of cerebro-vascular accident - anticoagulant therapy.

Spaw George Beverley "Bev," Sr. 23 Aug 1890 25 Dec 1974 Son of John Theoplas & Ella Magnolia (Blue) Spaw. Married 1) 1916 Willie Mae Peal died 1926 2) 1928 Myrtle Harrel divorced, 3)1933 Ethel May (Huffstetler) Clark died 1971. Warehouseman with LCRA. Died of chronic arteriosclerosis.

Spaw George Beverley, Jr. 17 Aug 1923 20 Mar 2009 Son of George Beverley & Willie Mae (Peal) Spaw. Married 1) Waunita Fay Martin - divorced. 2) Eleanor Elizabeth Sloan (died 1996), Fort Worth Public Library head reference librarian. Raised by his Peal grandmother in Dripping Springs after his mother died when he was 5. Served as pharmaceutical assistant in US NAVY in WW II. Varied career - barber, owned Able Refrigeration & Heating Co. After Eleanor's retirement, he became horticulturalist on his small farm near Bridgeport, Texas, and taught part-time in Tarrant County's Junior College's Horticulture Department. He also painted oils that were displayed in local banks.

Spaw James Philip 22 Aug 1939 20 Jan 2015 Son of George Beverley & Ethel May (Clark) Huffstetler Spaw. UT graduate, served in US Army in 1960s and spent most of his working life in the oil and gas industry. Lived in Houston with wife, Barbara.

Spaw John Reagan 18 Oct 1928 21 Sep 2001 Son of William Emmanuel. & Rosa Jane (Lyle) Spaw.

Spaw John Theoplas 20 Apr 1868 3 Jul 1938 Married Ella Magnolia (Blue) Spaw. Son of Beverley & Sisrelda (Dye) Spaw. Mail carrier & Justice of the Peace. Died of spastic paralysis of stomach and colon from gallstones.

Spaw Maurine (Elliott) 10 Nov 1917 26 Sep 2004 Daughter of Hiram Neal & Wille Maurine (Atkinson) Elliott. On stone/married 30 Mar 1941 Chester Lamar Spaw, son of G. B. & Willie Mae (Peal) Spaw.

Spaw Robert Eura Adams 21 Mar 1871 3 Jun 1918 Married to Ida Mae (Robbins) Spaw (31 Oct 1875 - 27 Jan 1970) daughter of W.H. & M.J. Robbins). Ida Mae is buried in Farmers Cemetery, San Angelo.

Spaw Rosa Jane (Lyle) 21 Sep 1901 5 Sep 2000 Married to William Emmanuel Spaw.

Spaw Rachel Sisrelda Emmerline (Dye) 14 Dec 1838 12 Apr 1893 Daughter of John H. & Elizabeth (Watson) Dye. Married to Beverley L. Spaw.

Spaw William Emmanuel 23 Aug 1888 15 Dec 1967 Son of John T & Ella (Blue) Spaw. Married 1) Winnie Hazel Smith - divorced - one son who changed his last name to Sullivan 2) in 1918 Rosa Lyle, daughter of Wm R. & S.E (Robbins) Lyle. Government hunter. Died of circulatory collapse, malignant lymphoma.

Sisters Mary & Margaret were wives of Thomas Breedlove (a cousin of some degree through their Breedlove grandmother) who ranched at Cherry Springs, being postmaster of Good. A descendent, Raymond Jenkins, married Della Mae Watson, granddaughter of W.H. & M.J (Cokerill) Robbins. Confederate soldier.

Stephenson Temple Taylor 28 Dec 1884 8 Dec 1886 Son of B.F. & I.A. (Pound) Stephenson. Died of croup.

Swift Jett Phillip 20 Mar 1984 20 Mar 1984 Granddaughter of Sterling A. & Vaniece (Spinks) Swift.

Swift Sterling Arthur "Bubba" 4 Jul 1930 16 Apr 1998 First husband of Vaniece (Spinks) Swift Rambin and shares a stone with her. Lt.jg US NAVY Korea. Bubba and Vaniece enjoyed traveling throughout the country in their RV until his sudden death. In 2011, Vaniece married her dear friend, James P. Rambin, Liberty Hill, Texas. She died four years later and is buried here with her first husband. See entry for Vaniece (Spinks) Swift Rambin.

Thurman Henry Garrett, Jr. 15 Apr 1855 2 Mar 1928 Son of Henry G. & Judia (Neal) Thurman. Married Margaret Caroline Maxey on 18 June 1871. Private Co B Frontier Forces (Texas Ranger) 1870-71. Rancher. Died of carcinoma of esophagus.

Thurman Henry Garrett, Sr. Oct 1823 20 Apr 1916 Son of Johnson Terrell & Roseanna (Boots - literal translation of Stiefel) Thurman. Married to Judia Neal (1822 - ?). Wife Judia's grave was moved in late 1930s from Thurman Bend Cemetery which was inundated by Lake Travis when the Mansfield Dam was constructed. Henry was born in Illinois so joined the Union army (his grave mistakenly indicated he was a Confederate) via Mexico, serving as a corporal in Co A, First Texas Regiment. He had bought land in 1861, before the war began. In 2015, Henry's family ordered a new gravestone that reflected his true Civil War affiliation which he had kept hidden during the Civil War from his Confederate neighbors in Travis County. He is listed in the 1890 special schedule of those who served in the Federal Forces during the Civil War from Nov 1862 to Oct 1865. In 1888, the Austin-American Statesman describes Henry as one of Travis County's "oldest and noblest sons." On his land on the west bank of the Col-

orado, he had fig and peach orchards and a bee cave. In 1900, Judia was dead, and Henry was living by himself in Travis County. In 1910, Henry was farming in Hays County. Living with him was his daughter, Ella, and her husband, Edward Milson (a well driller) and their family.

Thurman John 1877 1893 Son of Henry Garrett & Margaret Caroline (Maxey) Thurman
Thurman Judia (née Neal) 1822 1893 Daughter of James & Lavinia Neal. Wife of Henry Garrett Thurman Sr. In Thurman Bend Cemetery, Teck, Travis County, until Mansfield Dam was built, inundating the area, then moved here.

Thurman Margaret Caroline (Maxey) 4 Mar 1852 16 Aug 1918 Daughter of James & Margaret (Wells) Maxey. Married to Henry G. Thurman, Jr. Had 15 children. The Maxeys lived at Maxey Bend on the Colorado, northwest of Austin, near Baldwin Bend where the Thurmans had settled.

Tidd Harry Walton 8 Dec 1894 5 Jan 1895 Infant son of Harry P. & Tye B. Tidd. Harry P. Tidd (born circa 1852 in Maine) was the principal of Dripping Springs School from 1893 to 1895, moving on to Blanco and Brownwood.

Tinney George Washington 2 Aug 1900 6 Oct 1992 Son of John Lewis & Sarah (Trainer) Tinney. Married to Nellie A. Wilson. Owned John L. Wallace's place in 1937 when the State of Texas paid for 5.08 acres for right-of-way for Highway 290.

Tinney John Lewis Jr. 1 Dec 1861 22 Dec 1941 Son of John Lewis & Martha (Trainer) Tinney. On Stone/Sarah M. Tinney. Died of heat exhaustion and acute indigestion.

Tinney Maggie 1905 1906 Infant daughter of John Lewis & Sarah Melissa (Nichols) Tinney Nellie A. (Wilson) Married to George Washington Tinney Tinney 27 Aug 1911 1 Aug 1985 1871 1914 Daughter of Marcus D. Lafayette & Mary Ann (Casner) Tinney Sarah Melissa (Nichols) Nichols.On stone/John L. Tinney, Jr.

Tinney William Lewis 30 Mar 1898 15 Feb 1947 Son of John Lewis & Sarah Melissa (Nichols). Tinney. In 1918 draft registration, William was a farm laborer for B. F. Quick. Still a farm laborer in 1940, he was living in same house as brother, George W. Tinney, and wife Nellie in 1940. He was single.

Walker Beverley Otis 17 Aug 1920 23 Jul 2003 On stone/married 25 Dec 1941 to Lois Beacham Walker. Served in US Army WWII Worked at U.T. Power Plant in Austin.

Walker Lois (Beacham) 1 Dec 1918 6 Dec 2011 Daughter of Charles Mitchell & Emma (Fisher) Beacham in Milam County. Moved to Austin to study at Durham's Business School. Worked in Sears at Hancock Center, Austin, in the infants' and children's department.Married Beverley Otis Walker on Christmas Day 1941.

Walker Robert Franklin 30 Apr 1936 9 Sep 1992 Married 12 July 1959 to Georgia Ann (Huffman) Walker, (born 31 May 1938). SP4 US Army. Died Kaufman, Texas.

Wallace Eura Mae (Spaw) 3 Jul 1898 25 Jan 1944 Daughter of Robert Eura Adams & Ida Mae (Robbins) Spaw. Married 24 Apr 1915 J.P. Wallace, Jr (not the same as the J.L.Wallace family.) Daughter of Robert E. & Ida (Robbins) Spaw.

Walters Mattie Lou Brackenridge 20 Sep 1886 19 Jan 1917 Daughter of Samuel & Mary Elizabeth (Pound) Walters Hunt, granddaughter of Dr. Joseph & Sarah (Ward) Pound. Known as Lady Bird or Little Mattie. Never married. Music teacher. Died in Silver City, New Mexico, where she had gone for treatment of tuberculosis.

Watson Algie Burl "Bud" 1889 1934 Son of Andrew J. & Nannie (George) Watson. On stone/married 1 Sep 1907 Pearl (Robbins) Watson. Died of acute nephritis & periurethral abcess.

Watson Carrie Mae (née Stephenson) 25 Apr 1875 6 Feb 1967 Daughter of Benjamin Franklin & Indiana "Nannie" Stephenson, granddaughter of Dr. Pound. Married to Daniel Watson. Died of myocardial infraction, coronary arteriosclerosis, hypertensive/arteriosclerotic heart disease, multiple diverticulosis of colon, arthritis.

Watson Daniel 16 Nov 1864 4 Jan 1927 Son of Robert & Mildred (Darnell) Watson. Married 28 Sep 1893 Carrie Mae Stephenson, daughter of Benjamin Franklin & Indiana "Nannie" Stephenson. Editor and publisher of weekly San

Marcos paper "The Texas Democrat ." Served 1910-1915 as State Representative from Hays County. Agricultural superintendent for State of Texas. Died of thrombosis of the superior mesenteric artery.

Watson Hunt Boyd 1903 6 September 1933 Son of Daniel and Carrie May (Stephenson) Watson. Married to Clara Modelle (Davis) Young (1916-2006) who is buried in Houston. Had a career as a bank robber and was a suspect in the robbery of the bank in Kyle. He was incarcerated in Angola Prison, Feliciana, Louisiana, from which he made several escape attempts and was finally shot by a guard. He used various aliases, including Jim Yarrell and B.B. Gathrite

Watson Lola 27 Oct 1908 20 May 1956 Daughter of Algie Burl & Pearl (Robbins) Watson. Dietician. Died of coronary occlusion.

Watson Pearl (Robbins) 23 Oct 1889 4 Jul 1958 Born Lafayette County, Texas, to William Hudson & Mary Jane (Cockrell) Robbins. On stone/married 1 Sep 1907 to Algie Burl Watson. Died of coronary occlusion.

Watson Solon Bell 1911 4 April 1961 Son of Algie Burl & Pearl (Robbins) Watson. In 1930, living with his 80-year-old father and his stepmother, Nancy, and running the farm. Married 19 Apr 1935 Maxine Moore. In 1940 was a timberman with a copper-mining company in Globe, Gila, Arizona. In 1950, 38-yr-old Solon was the proprietor of a cafe in Globe, and his second wife Mary (aged 21), born South Dakota, was cashier/waitress in Globe. Died in Eola, Concho County.

Watt Indiana Elizabeth (Watson) 31 Jul 1901 21 Jun 1957 Daughter of Daniel & Carrie (Stephenson) Watson. In 1920, she was a stenographer in a real estate office in Austin. PFC Army Air Force WW II. On 13 December 1920, Indiana married Earl Stewart Watt (1898-1982). The couple was divorced, and in 1931 married Ruby Dorrace Ferguson, daughter of James and Miriam "Pa and Ma" Ferguson, 26th and 27th governors of Texas. Earl and Dorrace are buried in Austin Memorial Park Cemetery.

Whitney Roland E. 30 Jul 1935 11 Jan 2014 On stone/ married 4 Jun 1955 Shirley Ann Fenner. PFC US Marine Corps Korea

Whitney Shirley Ann (Fenner) 13 Mar 1935 3 Mar 1994 Daughter of Ralph Edwin & Irma Mable (Goodro) Fenner On stone/married 4 Jun 1955 to Roland E. "Bill" Whitney.

Wilbur Daniel Boone "Red" 16 Oct 1986 9 Oct 1988 Died in Travis county.

Woods Wilburn 23 Nov 1886 Tried to ride a wild horse which reared and fell on him. According to San Marcos Free Press, November 25, 1886, the saddle horn crushed him so badly he died three days later. He was the stepson of Mr. Reasus (sic) and left "a mother and others to mourn him."
