Collier, Vera (Martin) Follis

21 Aug 1912 - 2 Dec 1988

Daughter of Earl and Pluma (Cunningham) Martin. Married 1) David R. Follis, farmer, Dripping Springs, son of James Owen & Margaret E. (West) Follis, brother of Ennis Follis. 2) on stone/Robert Collier. Saleswoman and clerk/typist

Conn, Marjorie Ludean (Black) "Lu"

14 Nov 1924 - 22 June 2006 Daughter of Garrett & Minnie (Howard) Black. Married/on stone/Richard Dean Conn. Former member of Order of Eastern Star, Central City, Gilpin County, Colorado. Former dispatcher for Gilpin County Sheriff's Dept.

Conn, Richard Dean "Dick"

18 June 1922 - 1 Jan 2012

Born Hoxie, Kansas. Married 1943 Marjorie Ludean Black. Herded cattle and owned a gas station then joined Army Air Corps, serving in USAF for 27 years and logging 6500 accident-free flight hours, ending his career coordinating missile launches at Holloman AFB, New Mexico. Served as sheriff of Gilpin Co, Colorado for 10 years before retiring to Dripping Springs.

Conner, Mr and Mrs

Two separate small flat stones inscribed Mr Conner and Mrs Conner. They may well be Larkin Thomas Lafayette Conner(1860-1929) & wife Malinda Elizabeth Byrum (1863-1930) who were married in Bastrop County. In 1900 farming in Bastrop County but by 1910 were in Travis County. Circa 1917, the Conners had come to Driftwood to operate the Driftwood cotton gin. Their son, Jesse, stated he was living in Driftwood in his May 1917 WWI registration form. They were members of the Driftwood Baptist Church, with Mr. L.T. Conner serving as a deacon for a short time. In 1920, they were back in Travis County farming near Pflugerville. They are both buried in the Pleasant Grove Cemetery, Elgin, Bastrop County.

Corbett, Rev. Henry "Harry" Wentworth

11 Mar 1854 - 21 Mar 1926

Born in Ferozepore, Punjab, India, to English parents, Isaiah Wentworth and Mary Anne (Pate) Corbett. His father, a merchant, died in 1854, nine days before Harry was born. Educated in Oxford, England. After his mother remarried, Harry sailed for Galveston, Texas, circa 1873. First employed in Hays County at W.W. Haupt's Mountain City store where he met Christian Wilhelm who invited him to teach his children and others from neighboring ranches. Lived with Wilhelms for 22 years. Married Mary Rose Miles. Later farmed and taught at Driftwood's Reaves School. In 1900, became minister at Friendship Baptist then Driftwood Baptist Church. Renowned for his hellfire and brimstone preaching, so fervent one could almost smell the smoke, leading to many conversions among the young of the area. A medal, which probably belonged to Harry's father, from the 1843 Battle of Punniar, near Agra, was found on the Halls' property near Onion Creek.

Corbett, Hattie Amelia 27 Jan 1895 - 5 Jan 1919 Daughter of Henry W. & Mary M. (Miles) Corbett. Died in Spanish flu epidemic while her brother, Tom, was serving in WWI.

Corbett, Mary R. (Miles)

25 Feb 1858 - 1 May 1949 Born Atlanta, Georgia, to Andrew Weldon & Harriett Emma (Magness) Miles who moved to Hays County, Married to Rev. Harry Corbett. Died of arteriosclerotic heart disease and senile dementia in Kerrville.

Crenshaw, David Laurel

10 Feb 1920-2 Jul 2013

Bon to Dave Wesley & Irene (Hall) Crenshaw. UT Austin graduate, earning a freshman letter in baseball and basketball. Enlisted in Army Air Corps in WWII, had a 30-year career in USAF, retiring as a colonel. Met and married Doris Irene Baker while stationed at Camp Luna, Las Vegas, New Mexico. Retired to Westlake, Austin.

Crenshaw, Dave Wesley

18 May 1893 - 11 Jan 1980 Born at Blanco, son of William Hill & Cecilia Jane (McQueen) Crenshaw. Sgt in US Army in WWI. Married 8 May 1919 /on stone/Irene Hall. Drug store proprietor in Dripping Springs.

Crenshaw, Doris Irene (Baker)

2 Apr 1923-9 Nov 2014 Born to Oliver Ellsworth & Effie Belle (Baker) Baker. Married i1945 David Laurel Crenshaw whom she met while he was stationed at Camp Luna, Las Vegas, New Mexico.

Crenshaw, Irene Hall

13 July 1898 - 20 Dec 1993 Born to Laurel Fenton & Katie (Dorroh) Hall. School teacher. Married/on stone/ Dave Wesley Crenshaw.

Crenshaw, Mary Lynn 14 Sep 1950 - 2 Jul 1998 Born to David Laurel & Doris Irene (Baker) Crenshaw.

Crisp, Edith Maud (Whisenant) 5 Sep 1914-14 Sep 2015

Born at Krum, Texas, to Henry Richard & Vesta (Pierce) Whisenant. Married 1935 to Marcus J. Crisp, a locomotive engineer, living in Kingsville, Kleberg County in 1950.

Crisp, Lauren Bailey

23 Jan 1993-18 Feb 2012

Born to Paul & J. Nicole Crisp. Attended Blinn College, Brenham, for a semester, then moved to College Station. Walking with fellow Blinn student, James Ward, through a McDonald's parking lot near the Texas A & M campus with friends, they were viciously attacked. James Ward died in the car park. Friends drove Lauren to the hospital, but ran a red light, colliding with a pickup which caused Lauren's death. The victims' families sued McDonalds because they had not taken security precautions after multiple instances of late-night violence. At trial, the jury awarded a \$27 million verdict in favor of the families.

Crumley, Alma Gertrude (Duncan)

3 Oct 1928 - 8 Dec 1986

Son of Don Columbus & Bessie Mae (Wusterhausen) Crumley Sr. Married to Leona LaVerne (Hight).

Crumley, Don Columbus

1 Aug 1888 - 6 Mar 1948

Born in Austin to Dr. Sanford Ideila & Nancy Catherine M. (Riffe) Crumley. Rancher. Married 1) Nancy Killebrew 2) Bessie Mae Wusterhausen who later married Mr. Johnsey. Died at Buda of coronary artery occlusion. His sister, Beulah, married Charles Haydon.

Crumley, Don Elward

17 Dec 1948 - 25 Feb 2008 Son of Don Charles & Leona LaVerne (Hight) Crumley. Married Evelyn I. Trimble. Served 16 years in the US Army. Was employed 23 years by the City of Round Rock. Avid hunter, fisherman, gunsmith and car enthusiast.

Crumley, Gary Wayne 25 June 1951

Born Giddings to Don Charles & Leona (Hight) Crumley. Survived only seven hours, dying of atelectasis and pneumonary edema.

Crumley, Herbert F.

1 Aug 1887 - 28 Feb 1907 Son of Chapple C. & Mary Selena (Whisenant) Crumley.

Crumley, Leona LaVerne (Hight)

22 March 1929 - 6 Dec 2005 Born Junction, Texas, to Elward D. & Fannie Bell (Jackson) Hight. Married Don Charles Crumley.

Crumley, Mary Selina (Whisenant) 2 Dec 1849 - 21 Feb 1930 Born in Georgia to John Thompson & Elizabeth Caroline (Moore) Whisenant. Married to Chapple C. Crumley. Died of arterio-sclerosis

Crumley, Rosie Lee 9 Nov 1924 Daughter of Walter Delbert & Alma Gertrude (Duncan) Crumley.

Crumley, Roxie Lee (Langston)

Cutler, Carol Jane (Kroll) 15 Sep 1950-22 Jun 2022 Born Wilson County, Texas, to Louis John & Alice Eleanor (Gawlik) Kroll. Married to Gary Cutler, Sheriff of Hays County.

Cutler, Travis Allan 21 Jun 1977-8 Dec 2019 Born to Gary & Carol Jane (Kroll) Cutler. Degree in marketing from Texas Tech University. Regional sale representative for Hillman for two years before he died at the family ranch in Roosevelt, Texas.

Dabney, Henry Pope 10 Aug 1937-8 De 2014 Born Tarrant County to Virginius J. & Lillian Nancy (Hogg) Dabney. Married to Barbara Kale.

Dement, Edward Harvey "Pappy"

6 Jul 1848 - 23 Nov 1927

Son of Reuben & Synie L. (Glenn) Dement. Married Mary Ann English on 12 Jul 1869 in Washington County. Blacksmith at Fischer's Store before coming to Driftwood and buying Wes Puryear's blacksmith shop.

Dement, Mary A. (English)

5 Jan 1851 - 25 Jul 1922

Daughter of Aaron & Sally (Garland) English. Married Edward Harvey Dement. Died of acute dilatation of heart and Bright's disease.

Dildy, David Edmond

6 Mar 1883 - 9 Jun 1948

Son of John & Addie (Burrows) Dildy. Married Ida Ford then moved from Nashville, Arkansas, to Coupland, Williamson Co, Texas, then in 1922 to Driftwood. Was a rancher; operated a store for a while and had a barber's shop (first and only one in Driftwood); and operated a grist mill. Died of bronchiectasis and myocarditis.

Dildy, Ida (Ford) 15 Jun 1883 - 22 Mar 1973 Daughter of John & Alice (Ray) Ford. Married David Edmond Dildy. Died of pneumonia and chronic debility.

Dildy, James Hudson

20 Oct 1907 - 23 Jun 2002

Born Coupland, Williamson County, to David Edmond & Ida (Ford) Dildy. Family moved to Arkansas but returned to Flat Creek, Texas, when he was 12. Worked as a barber, butcher, school bus driver, and in construction before owning and operating the Driftwood Store. Married in 1928/on stone/ Leona Eckols. The store also housed the post office run by his wife, dry-cleaning and laundry pick-up service, service station and feed store. He also had a grist mill and raised sheep. They had no children so considered the community their family.

Dildy, Leona (Eckols)

26 May 1910 - 1 Oct 2000

Daughter of James Thomas & Maggie (Jones) Eckols. Married 1928/on stone/James Hudson Dildy. Driftwood post mistress for over 30 years, first filling in for brother-in-law,

Laurel Hall, during WWII. Officially appointed in 1947 until her retirement in 1976. Influenced Driftwood Community to enter the contest sponsored in 1957 by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service and the electric companies to improve communities in Texas. This led to the formation of the Driftwood Community Improvement Club which still functions to this day. The community participated in the program until 1974, winning a place each year, once first. Leona's combread recipe was also the inspiration for "The Home Place Cookbook." Very active in the Ladies Aid.

Dorsett, Donald Ray

2 Nov 1936-7 Apr 2002

Born to Huland Tim & Katherine Elizabeth (Dawson) Dorsett. Married 1999 Frankie Chaloupka. Served in USAF for four years, then gained bachelor's and master's degrees from Southwest Texas University, followed by post-graduate work at UT Austin and University of Houston. Was teacher, principal, then Director of Legal Services for Texas State Teachers Association, followed by school superintendent for Three Way ISD, Erath, Texas.

Dye, Georgia Christine (Edmonds)

Born Hillside, Carroll County, Virginia, to William & Bessie Edmonds. In 1949 became second wife of Clarence Eugene Dye. Attended a business college and moved to California where she worked for the USO. Human resources administrator.

Born to James Thomas "Jim" & Maggie (Jones) Eckols during the 1915 Camp Ben McCulloch reunion. Rancher of 1000 acres. Married 4 Dec 1942/ Edith Thelma Christal, daughter of Mack & Agnes (Ireland) Christal of Bear Creek Community. Served in WWII in the 796th Military Police Battalion. which supported the "Red Ball Express" truck convoy as it rolled from the beaches of Normandy to Berlin. Clarence vowed if he came back alive, he would never leave again, and pretty much stuck to that! With his wife, Edith, he ran his ranch at Driftwood and was very active in the community and in Driftwood Church.

Eckols, Edith Thema (Christal)

12 Sep 1922-25 Feb 2019

Born to Mack & Agnes (Ireland) Christal. Married Laredo 1942 Clarence Edwin Eckols just before he left for WWII. Edith followed him to Nyack where she worked in Wool-worths, then to Battle Creek, Michigan, where she made K-Rats for Kelloggs. When Clarence shipped out to Europe, Edith returned home where she worked in Woolworths then as a stenographer at UT, Austin, for the duration of the war. Clarence and Edith then moved to their ranch near Driftwood for the rest of their lives. Edith was a Baptist and Clarence a Methodist, but they were able to attend Driftwood Church which housed both congregations. Edith was am enthusiastic member of the Driftwood Ladies Aid.

When her two boys were grown, she worked for a few years at Sears in Austin then at the Driftwood Store.

Eckols, Dane Rhea

Born Madison Co., Tennessee to Noah Reese & Isabella (Harris) Waddell Eckols. Came to Texas in 1850, living in Gonzalez County then Guadalupe where his widowed mother married George W. Waddell. Was wounded as private in Texas Confederate militia. Married Ellen J. Hall. Moved to Mountain City then to Driftwood. Known as Uncle Tom, he was a self-made doctor whose services were much in demand in the area. One of original trustees of Driftwood Cemetery.

Eckols, James Thomas "Jim" Jr

Born in Caldwell Co. to James Thomas & Ellen Jane (Hall) Eckols. Rancher. As a boy, his job was to herd the goats and sheep. Died of cerebral thrombosis. Their children donated a stained glass window to Driftwood Church in their memory.

Daughter of James Thomas & Nancy Emma (Lester) Jones of the Bear Creek Community. Married James Thomas Eckols Jr. whom she met at a Camp Ben McCulloch Reunion. Died of coronary occlusion.

Eckols, Marie Oneta (Spaw) 17 Sep 1919-14 Feb 2014 Daughter of Johnnie & Mary (Applewhite) Spaw. Married 1941Jones Otis Eckols.

Eckols, Mary Ethel (Dorroh)

Alta (1873-1961) was daughter of William and Octavia Baker (Speed) Cannon -- Octavia was the daughter of Mathias & Ann (Butler) Speed. Alta operated a cafe in Kenedy, Karnes County. Herbert (1872-1954) worked at various businesses.

Garison, Rev. John Alexander

30 Aug 1849 - 29 Jul 1933

Born inn Tennessee to Samuel W & Ann Amanda (Vickers) Garison and grew up in Mississippi where he married 1)Mary Lasaphine Martin on 13 Aug 1871. Came to Martindale, Texas, in 1874 then to Driftwood in 1879. Licensed as a Methodist preacher in 1878, becoming a circuit-riding minister. Began his ministry at the Reaves School House just north of Driftwood. Later moved to Buda where wife, Mary, died. He later married 2)Jennie Weaver (schoolteacher at Salem School and former postmistress of Yell) of the Mt. Sharp Community. Died of diabetes and prostatitis. Stained glass window in Driftwood Church in memory of the J. A. Garison families was designed by his great-granddaughter, Mary Sue (Young) Lyle. His grave is inscribed, *"A Pioneer Preacher."*

Garison, Mary Lasaphine (Martin)

15 Nov 1847 - 11 Dec 1910

Daughter of Thomas & Mary Almyra (Hillyard) Martin. First wife of Rev. John A. Garison.

Garrett, Elizabeth

24 Jul 1881 - 12 Dec 1968

Daughter of William D. & Sallie (Pursley) Garrett. Taught in Hays County schools. In 1940 she was living with her sister and brother-in-law, Ed & Odie Watson. Died in Blanco Mills Nursing Home of myocarditis - chronic and carcinomatosis -generalized.

Garrison, S.T.E. "Ed" - note his family has added an "r"

14 Apr 1876 - 27 Apr 1950

Son of Rev. John A. & Mary Lasaphine (Martin) Garison. Married 1) Kate Brown and bought what later became known as the Wes Puryear place. Married 1929 2) Minnie Criser, a music teacher, daughter of Charles Wesley & Delia Jane (Jones) Criser, and widow of Dr. George M. Jameson. Ed and his brother John built most of the houses in Buda in the 1900s. Lived at 411 West 38th St, Austin - was a carpenter-contractor when he and Minnie died in an automobile accident one mile east of Houston on Hwy 90 - fractured skull and face and head crushed. Minnie also died of internal injuries from crushed chest and abdomen. Minnie is buried at Live Oak Cemetery, Manchaca, next to her first husband.

Garrison, Kate (Brown) 23 Sep 1881 - 29 Jul 1907 From Elm Grove Community near Buda. Married 1902 Ed Garrison.

Garrison, Katie Maud 30 Dec 1906 - 5 Apr 1908 Daughter of Ed & Kate (Brown) Garrison.

Glosson, Eldridge Bell "Pete"

1 May 1914 - 9 Sep 2004

Son of Solon Bell & Louise (Robbins) Glosson. Married 9 Sep 1939 to Naoma Myrtle Black whom he met at a Camp Ben McCulloch reunion. Lived in Dripping Springs. Mail carrier and school bus driver.

Glosson, Naoma Myrtle (Black) "Myrtie" 16 Nov 1914 - 8 Dec 2010 Daughter of Garrett & Minnie (Howard) Black. Married/on stone/ to Eldridge Bell Glosson. Very active in Dripping Springs United Methodist Church and UDC.

Gray, Alyne Wilma (Odom)

14 Aug 1910 - 15 Sep 2008

Born in Stanton, Texas, to Albert G. & Nannie B. (Dorroh) Odom. Her mother Nannie's diary provides a wonderful glimpse of teaching in the early Driftwood area. Early graduate of Texas Tech with B.S. in English, Alyne taught in Garden City where she married Robert L. Gray. Moved to Midland where she was owner/operator of Jack and Jill Private School from 1950-1975 where she taught both President and Mrs. George W. Bush.

Gray, Robert Odom,

9 Jun 1937-18 Jul 2014 Born in El Paso to Robert Odom & Alyne Wilma (Odom) Gray. Grew up in Midland, Texas. Graduated from Texas Tech University where he was a member of Delta Tau Delta. Became a career military officer, retiring from the US Army as a colone and settling in San Antonio. Became an award-winning watercolor artist.

Guinn, George R.

19 Dec 1845 - 26 Sep 1932

Born Colorado Co, Texas to G.W. & Dianna (Perry) Guinn. Private Co A 5th Regiment Texas Cavalry CSA. Married 1)on stone/Sophronia ? 2) 1898 Carrie Newman (1881-1969), daughter of William D. & Nancy Ann (Huggins) Newman. Carrie is buried in San Jose Burial Park, San Antonio. Cattleman in Driftwood area, then nightwatchman of the Kyle National Bank for seven years until a bank robbery occurred in 1912. Said to be so distraught he moved to San Antonio. Died of chronic myocarditis and retention of urine.

Guinn, Sophronia 28 Dec 1848 - 23 Jul 1896 Born in Alabama. Married to George R. Guinn.

Gunn, Hubert Sidney 12 Sep 1896 - 7 Feb 1961 Son of John Pinkney & Ida Rebecca (Harris) Gunn. Served in World War I. Married to Nina? Was a tailor in Trenton, Wayne, Michigan where he died of rupture of the esophagus, as a result of pulmonary emphysema and broncho pneumonia.

Gunn, Ida Rebecca (Harris) 14 Oct 1876 - 25 Oct 1966 Daughter of Samuel & Annie (Young) Harris. Married to John Pickney Gunn. Died in Houston of pneumonia

Gunn, John Pinkney 14 Jan 1872 - 3 Jun 1941 Son of James & Mary Ann (Wiggins) Gunn Redwine from Fitzhugh. Farmer & rancher. Married to Ida Rebecca Harris. Died of mitral deficiency of heart and impacted gall bladder and inability to retain and digest food.

Hall, Albert Frank

27 Nov 1904 - 1 Aug 1963

Son of Laurel F. & Katie (Dorroh) Hall. Married to Clara Williamson. Cattle Raisers' Association Inspector. Lived in Austin. Died of acute coronary occlusion due to arteriosclerotic heart disease. Served in military.

Hall, Clara Martha (Williamson) 19 Nov 1909 - 6 Aug 1995 Daughter of William W (Buddy) & Alice Marie (Haydon) Williamson. Married/on stone/ Albert Frank Hall.

Hall, David Clarence

3 Sep 1895 - 31 Mar 1966

Son of Laurel F. & Katie (Dorroh) Hall. Got teacher's certificate at Southwest Texas Normal School in San Marcos. Taught at Driftwood and Darden Hill. Corporal Co. B 141 Infantry in WWI. Accountant-investor with oil company in Tampico, Mexico, and Venezuela. When his health began to fail, built a house for himself and his mother in Austin, but after her death spent most of his time in his apartment at the old Hall homestead. Never married. 32nd degree Mason, member of Ben Hur Shrine and Rambo Lodge in Dripping Springs. Driftwood benefactor, making improvements to the church, community center, and cemetery possible. There is a stained glass window in "*loving memory*" of him donated by his family. Died of a coronary occlusion.

Hall, Emma Louise (Wood)

12 Aug 1923-9 Jul 2019

Born Bracketville to Cornelius Allan (Friebele) & Alice Wood. At age 5 when her father died, the family moved to San Antonio where she helped her mother repair and custom-tailor Cavalry uniforms. Married Sydney Hall whom she had bumped into at the Drift-wood Store when visiting her great-uncle and great-aunt, Herbert & Annie Schubert. Worked for several years at Sears in Austin, then was postmistress at Wimberley and Driftwood.

Hall, Fenton Brown 22 Sep 1823 - 1 Apr 1866 Born in Abbeville Co, South Carolina to Fleming & Margaret (Nance) Hall Married to Louisa Faulkner.

Hall, Frank Boyce

29 Feb 1868 - 14 Jan 1926

Son of Fenton Brown & Louisa (Faulkner) Hall. Married to Nova Josephine Speed of Bluff Springs community. He was member of the famous Driftwood baseball team of the 1890s. Mason. Founder member of Driftwood Methodist Church.

Hall, Infant Daughter of Frank and Nova Jo (Speed) Hall.

Hall, Infant Daughter 13 Feb 1886 - 24 Feb 1886 Born to J. P. "Jim" & Belle Hall. J.P. was a peace officer in Kyle.

Hall. Infant son 1902 Born to Laurel F. & Katie (Dorroh) Hall

Hall, Infant son 1903 Born to Laurel F. and Katie (Dorroh) Hall

Hall, James Andrew

1900 - 1975

Son of Laurel Fenton & Katie (Dorroh) Hall. Married Louise Holcomb. Was an independent tax consultant in Houston. Died of severe coronary artery sclerosis with myocardial infarction, old and recent

Hall, Katie (Dorroh)

1 Feb 1874 - 10 Aug 1957

Born Laurel, Mississippi, to David L. & Mattie (Martin) Dorroh. Sister Nannie, a teacher, wrote a diary about life in the area in the late 1800s. Married to Laurel Fenton Hall. Died of a myocardial infarction.

Hall, Laurel Fenton

28 Jan 1866 - 14 Aug 1931

Born in Belmont, Guadalupe County, Texas to Fenton Brown & Louisa (Faulkner) Hall. Married Katie Dorroh. Outstanding baseball player, on 1890s Driftwood team. Deacon in Baptist Church and school trustee. Stained glass window in Driftwood Church to Laurel & Katie Hall, donated by their children and grandchildren.

Hall, Laurel Fenton, II

9 Apr 1909 - 14 Feb 1958

Son of Laurel Fenton & Katie (Dorroh) Hall. Married/on stone/Louella Watson. Ran the store and was Driftwood's seventh postmaster and fourth mail carrier, his service there being interrupted for two years while he served as a corporal in 478 Service So AAF, WWII. Trustee of Driftwood School. Died of a coronary occlusion.

Hall, Louisa (Faulkner) 18 Oct 1828 - 26 Jan 1896 Born in Alabama. Married/on stone/Fenton Brown Hall.

Hall, Novazembla Josephine "Nova Joe" (Speed) 11 Oct 1870 - 26 June 1951 Daughter of John & Ann (Butler) Speed. Married 1888 Frank Boyce Hall. Died of generalized cardio vascular sclerosis in San Antonio.

Hall, Ronald B. 8 Oct 1934 - 26 Jan 1980 Son of Albert Frank & Clara Martha (Williamson) Hall. Lieutenant Colonel US Army in Vietnam. Married/on stone/Judy M. born 18 Dec 1944

Hall, Sydney

15 April 1916 - 22 Sep 2010

Son of Laurel Fenton & Katie (Dorroh) Hall. Married Emma Louise Wood whom he literally bumped into in Driftwood Post Office. Louise spent her summer with her great-aunt on the Schubert Ranch. Staff Sgt US Army WWII, Bronze Star Medal, serving with Patton's 42nd Rainbow Division at the Battle of the Bulge and Battle of the Ardennes. Was manager of the Gatewood Newberry Ranch for 35 years, turning it into a show place, as well as running his own home place.

Hamburger, Ken Richard

10 Mar 1943-19 Jul 2023

Born Virginia to Kenneth Richard & Olivia M. Hamburger. Moved to Illinois after his father returned from WWII. After graduating from a military academy and college, commissioned into USAF and underwent flight training. Married Maria L. when stationed in Texas. Later became a chief pilot for an energy company, then shifted to flight instruction on simulators before retiring to Driftwood.

Hamm, Linda Sue (Whisenant)

19 Sep 1950-22 Jun 2020 Born to Wilburn Laverne "John" & Caryle Mae "Tincy" (Jennings) Whisenant. Grew up in Johnson City. Married John L. Hamm — divorced. Died in Fredericksburg where she lived most of her life.

Hamm, Sjoni Lee 30 Aug 1970 - 17 Aug 1995 Born in Colorado to John & Lynda Sue (Whisenant) Hamm. Heart-shaped stone inscribed "*Our beloved daughter*" includes a photograph and the letter D. Died at Granite Shoals, Burnet, Texas.

Harmon, Frances Irene (Baker) Sansom

16 Apr 1912 - 28 Dec 2006

Born Millett, La Salle County, Texas, to Joseph Crawford & Lorine (Arnold) Baker. Married to 1) 1926 Hugh Alvin Sansom in San Antonio, shares stone 2) 1988 in Blanco County to John Foster Harmon. Lived in Dripping Springs and Henly. Was a nurse.

Harris, Annie (Young)

26 Oct 1858 - 12 Jun 1945

Born Symsonia, Graves Co, Kentucky, to Robert Sidney & Sarah Jane (Fletcher) Young. Married/on stone/ Samuel Lilburn Harris whose eighth child, Sam, was born posthumously. Annie carried on the farm and taught Sunday school in Methodist church. Annie, three children, and her parents, the Youngs, grace the cover of Linda Freeman's "*Around Dripping Springs*." Daughter Jennie, on right, is said to have been born in the tent. She married H. Wiley Roberts, son of Henry & Ellen Nora (George) Roberts, and they settled on the Rockin' P Ranch where descendant Pam Roberts and husband Scott McAfee now live. Scott is responsible for recording and photographing all the graves in the Driftwood Cemetery as part of The Tombstone Transcription Project.

Harris, Infant 1918 Child of Robert Lilburn & Mae (Hill) Harris. Premature birth.

Harris, Augusta Mae (Hill)

1891 - 1918

Born Missouri. Wife of Robert Lilburn Harris, Sr.

Harris, Robert Lilburn, Sr

23 Jul 1887 - 23 Feb 1936

Son of Samuel Lee & Annie (Young) Harris. Farmer. Married 1) Augusta Mae Hill and on her death lived for several years with his daughters at his mother's home 2) Maybelle Miller. Died in Santa Anna, Coleman Co, Texas, of lobar pneumonia.

Harris, Samuel Lilburn (or Lee)

25 Feb 1851 - 21 Jul 1891

Born Tennessee to James & Louisa (Buchanan) Harris. Married/on stone/ Annie Young on 2 Dec 1875 in Oak Hill, Travis Co. In 1883 bought land from Rev. Garison, a mile and half south of Driftwood. Lived in a military surplus tent until first crop was put in. Very active in Methodist Church. Died before last child born.

Harris, Thomas J.

8 Aug 1878 - 12 Jul 1888 Oldest son of Samuel L. & Annie (Young) Harris

Hauber, Dr. Janet Elaine

21 Jul 1937-27 Jan 2021

Born in Milwaukee, lived in Virginia, California, and Moscow. Bachelors degree in mechanical engineering from Marquette University then Masters in materials science and PhD in engineering from Stanford University. Retired after 34 - year career at University of California working on the development of nuclear weapons to serve as a deterrent to war. In 1998. spent two years at the Department of Energy, as program manager of "Swords to Ploughshares," earning a Distinguished Career Service Award from National Nuclear Security Administration. A philanthropist, she awarded forty-six \$1000 scholarships to aspiring women engineers, established a Presidential Endowed Scholarship for a female engineer undergraduate at the University of Texas, and donated \$50,000 for computer equipment to the university's student athlete center.

Head, Mable Alice (Miles) Lehman Sands

16 Sep 1917- 26 Jul 2014

Born Caldwell county to F.P. & Della (Sullivan) Miles. Married 1)William Lehman 2) Raymond Sands with whom she worked in his pharmacy 3) 1990 James Manley Head, Texas State Senator who is buried with his first wife in Texas State Cemetery. Lived in Wimberley where she sang with the Wimberley Community Chorus. After losing three husbands, she spent the last 17 years of her life with Jim Deloney.

Hennig, Lloyd Ivan

12 Apr 1923 - 4 Sep 2011

Born Valera, Texas, to Ivan & Alma Hennig. Served in USAF during WWII in Germany, France & England. Two years with Austin Police Dept, then two years at Driftwood with Ramsay's 777 Aberdeen-Angus Ranch before becoming foreman of the nearby Rutherford Ranch for 36 years. Married to Dolores Meinen. Served on Buda School Board and Hays Consolidated ISD.

Hetz, Evelyn Ann (Meek)

3 Sep 1935-24 Jan 2014

Born to Melvin & Cleo Maria (Hampton) Meek. Married 1983 Ralph Hetz. She was cremated but ashes were to be scattered in this cemetery.

Hetz, Ralph

20 Oct 1929-29 Aug 2016 Married to Evelyn Ann Meek. Cremated and ashes to be scattered.

Hibbs, Argie Lou "Gigi" (Hall)

6 Mar 1940-13 Feb 2013

Born to Laurel Fenton & Louella (Watson) Hall II. Married 1) Franklynn Edward Rieger (auto mechanic, construction worker, and a race car driver) 2) Lt. Col. Carroll "Sonny" Hibbs Jr. (his second wife). Argie spend her life in Driftwood and at her cabin in Pagosa Springs, Colorado. Attended Camp Ben McCulloch Confederate Reunion every year of her life.

Hight, Elward Delaney

1907-1979 Born to William Monroe & Mary Gertrude (Adams) Hight. Married/on stone/ Fannie Belle Jackson. Died in Austin.

Hight, Fannie Belle (Jackson) 3 Apr 1909 - 29 May 1976 Daughter of John Thomas & Rosa Lee Jackson. Married/on stone/Elward Hight. Worked in food service for Travis State School. Died of acute pulmonary embolism and carcinoma of the cecum.

Hinch, William Louis 15 Aug 1955 - 24 Apr 2004 Son of John Joseph & Betty Ross (Fryer) Hinch. Married to Diana Majure. Lived in New Braunfels.

Holland, L'Lenious Boyer "Lennie" 25 May 1866 - 25 Oct 1948 Born in San Antonio to John & Margaret (Neal) Holland (both born in England). Married to Mary Hunt. Rancher. Died in Bastrop of carcinomatosis.

Holland, Mary (Hunt) 27 Feb 1870 - 19 Nov 1954 Daughter of William & Elvia (Lambert) Hunt. Married to L'Lenious Boyer Holland. Died of cardiovascular influenza.

Horn, Grace (Hill?)

1893 - 1920

Born Elsinore, Missouri. Married to Emerson Bryan Horn. In 1920, the pair were lodging in Precinct 5, Hays County, with widowed blacksmith, James W. Hill, likely her father, and his 17-year-old daughter, Eula. Emerson was a garage mechanic.

Horn, Infant

This may be the child of Emerson B. & Grace Horn. Grace died aged 22 in 1920.

Howard, Annie Louise (Eckols)

15 Jan 1873 - 3 Dec 1953

Daughter of James Thomas & Ellen (Hall) Eckols. Married to Edgar Forrest Howard. After the death of her husband and little son, "Miss Annie" had a millinery shop in her house behind the Driftwood Store. Later she and remaining child, Verna, moved to Austin. Died in Austin, of cardiac degeneration, marked secondary anemia and chronic glomerulonephritis.

Howard, Carl M.

21 Jan 1888 - 12 Dec 1955

Son of James Thomas & Sarah "Bettie" (Mitchel) Howard. Never married. Farmer. Died of coronary occlusion, arteriosclerotic cardio-vascular disease, essential hypertension.

Howard, Charles Arthur

15 Nov 1896 - 12 Jul 1943

Son of James Thomas & Sarah "Bettie" (Mitchel) Howard. Married in 1923/on stone/ Lois J. Rogers. Had planned to be a lawyer, but WWI changed that. He was a sergeant in the US Army Air Service. On his return, he became rural route carrier for Driftwood Post Office for the rest of his life. Died of pneumonia and high blood pressure and uremic poisoning. After Charles's death, Lois married W.M. Pevehouse.

Howard, Christopher Columbus "Lum" 19 Jul 1877 - 18 Jun 1944 Born Guadalupe Co, Texas, to James Thomas & Sarah "Bettie" (Mitchel) Howard. Farmer. Married Martha Ann Ash, daughter of John and Hughina (McDonald) Ash. Hughina and her sister Isabella emigrated from Ross-shire, Scotland. Isabella married another Scot, Donald McKenzie who ranched south of Driftwood (later sold to Gatewood Newberry). Martha Ann Ash was Lum's first love but she married Jim Holt, then, after his death in the line of duty as a peace officer, married Lum. Lived at Manchaca then bought the old Howard homestead and returned to Driftwood. Died of coronary thrombosis and malignant high blood pressure. Martha (17 May 1880-18 Aug 1962) is buried in the Masonic Cemetery, Austin.

Howard, Dora

3 February 1884 - 25 April 1943 Daughter of James Thomas & Sarah "Bettie" (Mitchel) Howard. Never Married. Died of shock, due to trauma, fracture of the left humerus and left tibia and cardiac failure in automobile accident in Austin.

Howard, Edgar Forrest 17 Aug 1875 - 30 Dec 1903 Born to James Thomas & Sarah "Bettie" (Mitchel) Howard. Married to Annie Eckols.

Howard, Edgar Forrest "Little" 17 Dec 1903 - 16 Nov 1906 Son of Edgar Forrest & Annie (Eckols) Howard.

Howard, Grover G. 20 Feb 1886 - 18 Dec 1886 Infant son of James Thomas & Sarah "Bettie" (Mitchel) Howard.

Howard, Infant son 1929 - 25 Jul 1929 Son of Olen & Alma (Alexander) Howard. Alma's sister, Beatrice was married to Olen's brother, Jesse Howard.

Howard, James Deroy

Circa 1910 - 9 Feb 1991 Son of James Iverson & Lucy (Garrett) Howard. Worked in income tax in Austin. Married Minnie Lee Rumsey (1922-1997), daughter of John & Myrtle Rumsey, Turnerville, Texas. Minnie Lee is buried in the Bagdad Cemetery, Leander, Williamson County.

Howard, James Iverson 22 Sep 1879 - 30 Nov 1952 Son of James Thomas & Sarah "Bettie" (Mitchel) Howard. Married Lucy Garrett Died of chronic myocarditis, arteriosclerosis, generalized and chronic nephritis.

Howard, James Thomas 10 Dec 1847 - 17 Jul 1910 Born North Carolina. Private 12th Regiment Mississippi Infantry, CSA. Was a surveyor when he married Sarah "Bettie" Mitchel in De Soto, Mississippi. Came to Texas with John A. Garison and family. First rented farm on San Marcos river then bought land on Onion Creek. He is credited with changing with the name of the community from Liberty Hill to Driftwood. When the idea of a post office was mooted, it was discovered there was already a Liberty Hill Post Office. Noticing a pile of driftwood washed up by a recent Onion Creek flood outside Tom Martin's house (where the new post office would be), he suggested that, and the name stuck.

Howard, Jesse Robert

24 Aug 1910 - 22 Sep 1949

Son of James Iverson & Lucy (Garrett) Howard. Married to Beatrice Alexander who later married Mr. Bertleson. Was a roller operator in construction. Died of cerebral hemorrhage from severe crushing injury to chest and abdomen when run over by a heavy road roller in an automobile/roller accident on highway at Elgin, Bastrop County.

Howard, Lucille

12 Sep 1930 - 17 Nov 1934 Daughter of Olen & Alma (Alexander) Howard. Died of enteric colitis.

Howard, Lucy (Garrett)

7 Apr 1883 - 9 Feb 1971

Daughter of William D. & Sally Elizabeth Pursley. Married/on stone/James Iverson Howard. Died of arteriosclerotic heart disease.

Howard, Sarah Madora "Bettie" (Mitchel)

26 December 1854 - 6 December 1940

Born in Marshal County, Mississippi, to Mr. & Mrs. (Fitzgerald) Mitchel but orphaned at 14. Married in De Soto, Mississippi, 1874 /on stone/James Thomas Howard. They traveled to Texas with John A .Garison and family. On wagon journey from Galveston to Driftwood, Bettie barbecued meat by first searing, then slow cooking over coals, the method still used by great-grandson, Scott Roberts, at his world-famous The Salt Lick BBQ. Died of arteriosclerosis. There is a stained glass window in the memory of James and Bettie Howard in the Driftwood Church.

Howell, Lawrence Justin

15 Sep 1961-7 Aug 2018

Jacks, Erwin Paul 9 Jun 1914 - 30 Nov 1980 Son of David Crockett & Nannie (Dement) Jacks. Graduated from UT Austin. S1 US Navy WWII. School teacher. Worked in chemical plant. Died in McLennan, Texas.

Jacks, Evelyn (Braden) McPhail 4 Nov 1919 - 22 Jul 1986 Lived in Michigan. Married Erwin Paul Jacks, her second husband. Died Waco, Texas.

Jacks, John Thompson

21 Jun 1837 - 29 Apr 1882

Born in Tennessee to William Martin & Narcissia Temperance (Redding) Jacks and moved to Lavaca County, Texas. Enlisted as a private in Capt. Frederick J Malone's Cavalry Company 24th Brigade Texas State Troops which became Co A 12th Regiment Texas Infantry. Married Leah Abigail McGonagill. Moved to Driftwood to north of first crossing of Onion Creek on Kyle Rd. Had a steel cable rigged to a fence and leading 200' to the creek so his daughters could draw water from it without leaving the yard. Killed a few years later when he slipped off the 100' bluff. One story is that he slipped while attempting to retrieve a stray goat. The other more sinister story is the claim that he had been shot in the head. Daughter of Henry & Viola (Boyd) Whisenant. Married to Raché Guinn Johnson. Raché was a Sgt Provost Texas Guard, WWI and a farmer and rancher. Raché was born on 25 Jun 1895 to Edward Titus & Annie Laurie (Yeoman) Johnson and died10 Jan 1951 of acute coronary occlusion. He is buried in the Butler Family cemetery just to the south of the Onion Creek double crossing.

15 Sep 1896 -13 Sep 1919 Born to F. M. & Eliza (Watson) Needham. In 1900, seven-year-old Martha was living with her grandparents, Martin Luther & Catherine (Crawford) Watson, near Dripping Springs. Died of pulmonary tuberculosis.

New, Ellen (Harris)

Daughter of Sam L. & Annie (Young) Harris. Married/on stone/ Willis New. Public school teacher, including Driftwood. Lived in San Marcos. Ellen is on far left on the front cover of Linda Freeman's "*Around Dripping Springs*." Died of septicemia - etiology undetermined. Chronic urinary tract infection. Paralysis both lower extremities for more than 15 years. Cord tumor.

New, Willis Kenton "Ned"

12 Apr 1880 - 7 Mar 1969

Born Lockhart to William Henry & Mary Ann (Florida) New. Married/on stone/Ellen Harris. Died of generalized arterio-sclerosis.

Newberry, Gatewood

16 Jul 1907 - 10 Dec 1988

Born Canyon City, Randall, Texas, to William Hardin & Mittie Lucetta (Gatewood) Newberry. Graduated from Baylor and later UT. Taught and coached at Bastrop High School at the time of his marriage in 1930 to his first wife, Velma Brown, born in Oklahoma to Charles W. & Nora E. (Keyes) Brown. Taught and coached in San Antonio before coming to Austin as an investor and businessman, buying Tarrytown Pharmacy soon after its opening in 1942. Sold it to his brother Jack in 1950. Two years later he bought the McKenzie Ranch south of Driftwood, run for him by Sid Hall. Born Nyack, New York, to Joe & Peggy Rabb. Married 1) Jan Jarbow - divorced 2) Rev. Suzanne Field. B.A in Philosophy from Austin College, MA in Counseling Psychology from Trinity University, and Master's in Divinity from Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary. Ordained as a Methodist minister in 1975 serving in several places including Dripping Springs United Methodist Church. In charge of the office of the Mission Volunteers of General Board of Global Ministries of Methodist Church, he was at a meeting in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, when the 2010 earthquake struck. He was trapped in the rubble of the Hotel Montana for two days before he was rescued by a French doctor amputating his legs. He died in hospital in Broward County, Florida. Born in Liberty, Texas, to Gatewood & Velma (Brown) Newberry. Married Mack Richard Roberson. Taught at Patrick Henry JHS, Austin, and at UT Women's Gym. Member of Kappa Kappa Gamma, Junior League of Austin, The Settlement Club, The Davis Mountains Trans-Pecos Heritage Association, and the Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association. Latterly engaged in operation of her cattle ranches near Alpine, Brewster County, and near Datil, Catron County, New Mexico.

Roberson, Larry Randall "Randy"

26 Oct 1959-9 Oct 2022

Born to Mack Richard & Carole (Newberry) Roberson. Married 1981, Debbie Froman. Graduated from Howard Payne University, Brownwood, with degrees in Economics and Business. Worked as stock and commodities broker for 20 years then managed his ranch in Datil, New Mexico. Returned to Driftwood in 2017. Diagnosed in his 30s with myotonic muscular disease.

Roberts, Hisako (Tsuchiyama)

20 Nov 1913-18 Jan 2018

Born Lihue, Kauai, Hawaii to Wakayo & Yuki Tsuchiyama. Married Thurman Lee Roberts. Graduate of University of California, Los Angeles. Returned to teach in Kauai where she met Thurman who was serving in the Navy during WWII. In 1967, Hisako and Thurman founded The Salt Lick Barbeque which she ran with her husband, then with her son, Scott.

Roberts, Nana V

25 Feb 1911 - 13 Jun 1929

Daughter of William Thomas & Roxie (Howard) Roberts. Died two weeks after graduating from Buda High School of erysipelas (streptococcal infection) which developed from a small pimple on her face that became infected.

Roberts, Roxie Elma (Howard)

5 Mar 1891 - 21 Aug 1969

Daughter of James Thomas & Sarah Madora (Mitchel) Howard. Married/on stone/ William T. Roberts -- against the wishes of her parents who thought she was too young and they did not care for the *"whisky-drinking, guitar-playing Roberts,"* according to her grandson. Member of the Eastern Star and the UDC. Died of uremia, arteriosclerosis and cardiac decompensation.

Roberts, Thurman Lee, Sr

27 Oct 1908 - 29 Apr 1981

Son of William Thomas "Bill" & Roxie (Howard) Roberts. Married to 1) Elna Ludean Dodson, daughter of Hardin T. & Ella Morrison (Russell) Dodson (owner of Driftwood Store and post master) 2) in 1946 in Gregg County, Texas, Hisako Tsuchiyama, native of Hawaii & graduate of UCLA. Served in US Navy WWII, stationed on Kauai where he met

Hisako. Was in the bridge construction business but wanted to settle back home, so first tried truck farming, making candles, raising pecans and running a shelling business. Finally settled on selling barbecue in 1964 -- and The Salt Lick was born, using his grand-mother's cooking method and his wife's secret sauce recipe.

Rogers, Edna Gabrella (Oldham)

12 Feb 1859 - 11 Dec 1952

Daughter of Overton & Nancy (Woodward) Oldham. Second wife of Joseph B. Rogers. Sister-in-law of Dr. Joseph Pound's daughter, Lovonia (Pound) Oldham. Died in Confederate Womens Home in Austin of myocarditis.

Rogers, Elizabeth Anne (Cartledge)

15 June 1930-13 April 2014 Born Austin to Robert Lee & Elinor (Schley) Cartledge. Her early summers were spent inTerlingua where her father managed the Chisos Mining Company. Married Joe Robert Rogers.

Rogers, Hester Olivia (Davis) 1840 - 1913 Born South Carolina to M.J. & Adaline G. Davis. Married Mississippi 1862, to Marquis Lafayette Rogers.

Rogers, Infant

1888 - 15 May 1888

Infant of John B. & Emma Frances (Hancock) Rogers. John B. (1859-1944) was son of Joseph B. & Anna Maria (Jones) Rogers. Farmed on land given to him by his parents then became a restaurant owner in Austin. Emma (1859-1954) was the daughter of John B. & Sarah Hancock.

Rogers, Joseph B.

17 Mar 1833 - 20 Jul 1912

Born at Hornsby Bend, Austin, to Joe & Nancy Rogers, members of Stephen F. Austin's "Little Colony." His father fought in the Texas War of Independence, was a captain in Texas Ranger Force and was killed by the Comanche. Married 1) Anna Maria Jones in 1855, lived in Bastrop, Comal, and Blanco counties, raising cow ponies. Served in CSA as sergeant in Terry's Texas Rangers, General Forrest's Brigade, Company D, 8th Texas Cavalry. Moved to Hays County and raised quarter horses and race horses. Married 2) Edna Gabrella Oldham in 1898. Sold 35 acres in 1904 for a permanent camp ground for "The Reunion" - Camp Ben McCulloch. Built house that now bears a Texas Historical Marker.

Rogers, Martin Oldham

4 Dec 1899 - 5 Feb 1975

Only child of Joseph B. & Edna Gabrella (Oldham) Rogers. Farmer and rancher. Married/on stone/Minnie Lea Posey. Died of heart attack - instant, history of heart condition.

Rogers, Minnie Lea (Posey)

24 Jan 1904 - 14 Jan 1999

Born Manor, Texas, taught at Driftwood School then in Rio Grande Valley. Married Martin Oldham Rogers. Very active in the Driftwood Community and responsible for "Driftwood Heritage, *The History of Driftwood, Texas.*" Staunch member of Ladies Aid.

Rogers, W. M. 20 Dec 1884 - 16 Dec 1886 Son of Jonathan B. & Emma F. (Hancock) Rogers **Rule**, Charlotte "Loraine" (Ellis) 4 Jan 1930 - 23 Feb 2012 Born in San Marcos to Houston H. & Naomi (Reasoner) Ellis. Married 1) Dan Truitt Owens 2) 1986/on stone/Michael Arthur Rule.

Rule, Michael Arthur 15 Mar 1937 - 29 May 1999 Born McPherson, Kansas, to William & Virginia Mae Rule. Second husband of Charlotte Ellis/on stone.

Ruston, Alta Matilda (Blackstock) 22 Jan 1892 - 26 Oct 1982 Born Gonzales, Texas, to William (Parks) & Sarah M. (Goff) Blackstock. Married to Alvin Daniel Ruston.

Ruby (1916-1995) was the widow of Clarence Campbell(1915-1977) and is buried with Clarence in Phillips Cemetery, Dripping Springs. Member of Rambo Masonic Lodge #426, Dripping Springs.

Ruston, Roy Newman

Son of Ira Newman & Lillie Pearl (McIntyre) Ruston. Married Sandra Louise Cauthen. Joined Local 286 as journeyman welder, pipe-fitter, and instructor, serving as apprentice coordinator and business agent. His passion was creating knives from scratch. Operated a cotton mill on San Marcos River with his brother. Moved several times and separated from Beulah in 1913. Latterly Beulah moved to San Marcos where she died of broncho pneumonia, arteriosclerotic heart disease.

Wilhelm, Amelia V.

26 June 1965 -14 Dec 1925

Daughter of Christian & Catherine (Rissman) Wilhelm. Never married. Dressmaker and milliner. Died of broncho pneumonia in Los Angeles, California where she had lived for the past 12 years. Occupation give as maid.

Wilhelm, Anne Morgan

26 Aug 1871 - 10 Sep 1955

Daughter of Christian & Catherine (Rissman) Wilhelm. Never married. Teacher in Austin, Driftwood, Goforth, and San Antonio. Died of multiple myeloma.

Wilhelm, Catherine (Rissman)

1836 - 1917

Arrived from Alsace-Lorraine with her parents -- George & Mary C (Guschaff) Rissman - at Indianola in 1848, part of the Castro Colony, settling in D'Hanis, before moving to San Antonio where her father was a shoemaker then north to Cedar Valley. Married to Christian R. Wilhelm.

Wilhelm, Christian Roldan (von Hesse)

1819 - 1897

Arrived from Germany in 1837 under Prince Carl of Solms-Braunfels' Adelverein scheme, but headed for Austin. Had some medical experience which he used to nurse measlesepidemic patients in a Mormon settlement near Austin. Cabinetmaker and carpenter. Lived with Lewis Capt in Oakhill next to Henry Thurman (buried at Wallace Mountain) who employed him to build his house on the Colorado river. Worked on the Land Office Building in Austin and was paid in land (2,185 acres) in Hays County by State of Texas, and was employed by Abner Cook (who built the Governor's Mansion). Met and married Catherine Rissman in Austin where they had two sons who died - Catherine blamed the unsanitary conditions there and persuaded Christian to move out to their Hays Co. property. Supplemented income by outside work, e.g., laying stones for 1882 Hays County Court House and the woodwork of Joe Rogers' house. Children rode to school until their horses bolted, leading him to hire Englishman, Harry Corbett, as their teacher. None of his six daughters married. Both his sons did, but only Justus had issue. Justus brought first electric lights to the Camp Ben McCulloch reunion in 1903 and about the same time had the first telephone in Driftwood by stringing a line to his ranch.

Wilhelm, Elizabeth

Daughter of Christian & Catherine (Rissman) Wilhelm - twin with Joseph. Never married. Retail milliner in San Antonio. Died of metabolic carcinoma of the chest and goiter, carcinoma of stomach - operated on the previous year

Lived in Buda and Driftwood. Sunday school superintendent in Driftwood Methodist Church. Died of cerebral hemorrhage, cerebral arteriosclerosis & chronic hypertension, arteriosclerosis generalized.
